Ponderings From Your Pastor

Romans 8:37-38

In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.



Do you remember the old song from Sesame Street, "Oh who are the people in your neighborhood, in your neighborhood...they're the people that you meet when you're walking down the street, they're the people that you meet each day".

A newsletter from the synod office suggested that to open or not to open for worship is NOT the question. Instead the bishop invited congregations, pastors and councils to have conversations asking things like: Where is our mission leading us to right now? How do we serve our neighbors "knocking at our digital door"? What do the people around us need and how can we serve them? What is God calling us to for the sake of the world? What does it mean to be church today?

It's like when the pandemic struck churches across the nation hit the pause button. We hunkered down to wait out the storm expecting to come out after a few weeks, then a few months, and now we have so many confusing messages swirling around us. Will we have a vaccine by the end of the year? Schools are preparing to open and what will that look like? How will those decisions impact those of schoolchildren's parents? As a country, state, and community we continue to wrestle with important choices and decisions.

But what's become abundantly clear to me as we continue to linger in this liminal time in between, is we continue on as church, we continue on as disciples of Christ, we continue on with God's work using our hands for the sake of our neighbor. It's time to hit the start button continuing on with the work given to us in this new way of being.

All around us people are coming up with creative solutions to new problems. Our neighbors who meet at our church for Tai Chi have moved out into the parking lot to have space to distance and be outdoors in the fresh air. Churches are meeting in parking lots, and parks, getting creative about communion and other practices of the church.

August 2 we will be baptizing Spencer James Lewis at our upper parking lot service and also resuming communion. Ushers will dispense the individually wrapped communion sets as members arrive in their cars. At the appropriate time we will partake in communion together. To allow communion for some, and not others is not in keeping with the practices of our denomination. I'd ask you to prayerfully consider becoming a communion minister to deliver communion to those who are aren't able to attend services in person for any number of reasons. As the communion would already be blessed, those delivering the communion could offer it simply with the words, the body and blood of Christ given for you.

At the July council meeting the council voted to continue worshipping outside and will readdress the best place to worship at the August meeting. This newsletter also contains an article from the reopening team to help us prepare for transitioning to worshipping inside. We want to give everyone plenty of time to receive the information they need so when that first Sunday comes every member can worship assured that we are doing all we can to make the experience as safe as possible.

In this time of finding creative new ways to continue to worship God in as safe a way as possible we thank you for your continued financial support. Please continue to give as you are able knowing that especially during this time of uncertainty every gift is essential to continue the work and ministry of Emanuel Lutheran Church.

We are church together for the sake of the world.

Safety Team statement on reopening:

Back in June a team was organized to help plan a safe reopening of Emanuel. This team includes members from Worship and Music and the Safety Team. Those members are as follows:

Together we have researched and planned what we feel is a safe way of reopening Emanuel when the Council feels it is appropriate. I wanted to share a preview of how things will look as it will be different from the services we have come to love. Together we can do our part in helping curb this pandemic and find our way back to Sunday Services and Fellowship. Please feel free to reach out to Mike Garreans or myself with any questions

- 1. Signs are posted at the entrance asking that anyone who is sick or showing symptoms of illness or have traveled in past 14 days please refrain from attendance and use the church services we post online.
- 2.Physical distancing is respected (six feet apart), and traffic flow inside the building is structured to facilitate this. Look for tape on the floor. We will also have ushers to assist you.
- 3.All doors inside the building are kept propped open, to minimize touching doors and handles.
- 4.We won't be using bulletins except for a few large print bulletins for those with low vision. Our services will be projected for us to follow along.
- 5.Anyone uncomfortable returning to church should feel free to stay home, assured that we understand. This is an individual choice, and we will respect it.
- 6.Communion: On August 2nd we will begin distributing communion using individually sealed wafer/wine combo servings.
- 7.We have suspended the meet-n-greet as well as the line after church. Ushers have returned to the tradition of dismissing pews in an orderly fashion. Pastor Cara and Cindy will stay near their areas and return to them after worship. Feel free to make an appointment to visit with Pastor Cara by phone, email, text, or Messenger.

- 8.Offering plates are no longer passed around. Members put their offerings in designated plates located by the two front exit doors as they leave the service.
- 9. Everyone should enter through the main doors of the church and will be escorted to a seat by an usher.
- 10. To facilitate proper distancing and for ease of cleaning and disinfecting we will be meeting in the fellowship hall. For the time being, we won't be sing-

ing or praying/speaking in unison, such as the Lord's Prayer, Creeds, Prayers of the People and etc.

- 11. Chairs are disinfected after each use.
- 12.Other activities are suspended for now. We will revisit this as the pandemic subsides.
- 13.Coffee and donuts are paused for now.
- 14.Bathrooms are available, but cannot be disinfected after every personal use. While they are regularly cleaned and sanitized, it is best to "save it until you get home."
- 15.We encourage everyone to take advantage of our online devotions and worship. We offer several online forums in which to build up our community throughout the week: Facebook, YouTube devotions and updates. This allows our public forums to serve as places of encouragement and positive outreach.
- 16. Masks will be required when inside the building. You are welcome to use your own and if not we will have them available.
- 17. Gathering in groups, whether in the building, right outside the doors or in the parking lot before or after service will also not be allowed.

2021 ELCA YOUTH GATHERING


After much prayer and consideration, the ELCA has decided to postpone next summer's ELCA Youth Gathering to 2022 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by President Mike Winter. Char Les Kemmish gave devotions.

Guests from the Safety Committee in attendance: Mike Garreans, Cindy Richards, Mike Hipnar, Kevin Epperson. The members referred to the "Return to Worship" plan the committee had developed. They recommended continuing with the current plan to keep the church closed and continue with online and outside worship. The church will remain closed with online and outside worship continuing. This plan will be reviewed at the August Council meeting.

Motion carried.

A written report from the Property Committee was reviewed. Rosie Spangenberg reported from the Worship and Music Committee that the garage sale scheduled for August has been tentatively rescheduled for September. This will be reviewed and information will be shared with the congregation.

Pastor's report:

Pastor Cara has supplied her sister and brother-in-law, who live in Hawaii, with materials to review in preparation for becoming members of Emanuel. Joel made a motion to accept Miranda and Paul Schwartz as remote members. Steve Lewis second-

ed. Motion carried.


