Taking Care of Yourself and Others

Good afternoon! At our last meeting for Ale and the Almighty we discussed how we can love difficult people. Sometimes it's more loving people in difficult situations, such as when we disagree strongly with someone else. Regardless of where you find yourself on the political spectrum I'm sure we can all agree that our current administration's approach of making numerous and big changes quickly has lots of fallout that impact our neighbors. I've spent lots of time wondering what to do with this urge to help and where to best use my time, energy and resources. My bucket is filled when I can step in and help people out in significant ways—being able to lend a helping hand when someone is

struggling to meet their basic needs like food or housing, or dealing with a health or other emergency. I believe I would be most satisfied in making visible changes in my local world. Like the old song says, brighten the corner where you are. A friend of mine made a list of 25 things she plans to do in 25 to change the world. I was inspired to create my own list that I share with you now:

Personal Care

- · Pray/meditate at least 15 minutes daily

- Meet regularly with my spiritual director and therapist

- Research/read my particular areas of historical interest
- Support the arts through offering gatherings in my home
- Help connect other artists with resources

Family (of all kinds) building

- Try to see things from the other person's perspective
- Work together creatively to resolve conflict
- · Be lavish with expressions of love

Faith building

- Look for connections between the gospels and today's world, then preach about it
- Pray for and with my Emanuel community and wider faith community
- If elected as our conference representative, continue serving on the synod council
- Sent regular notes/cards of encouragement to our synod staff and bishop
- Find ways Emanuel can support the work and ministry of Western Iowa synod

Community building

- Continue to participate in the NAMI board of directors and executive community
- Check in regularly with my community contacts how can Emanuel be of assistance?
- Encourage and support Emanuel's community volunteering
- Look for ways for our youth to volunteer in our community
- Support a school board or city council candidate in their election efforts

Build a Longer Table

"Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God." Romans 15:7

Last month we had an opportunity to travel to Lutheran Lakeside Camp to learn more about Reconciling Works. This is a program that has been around since 1974 and helps churches build an inclusive church community that actively advocates and welcomes everyone.

This is a process that can take several years. Emanuel's inclusion statement that was adopted several years ago actually cover a lot of the things that would qualify us for this program already, but there are several educational pieces that would be a part of this journey well.

This is not something that one or two people decide. Churches who want to become an RIC church have a task force that would help lead the way. It involves a lot of education and congregational support. This takes six months minimum, up to several years. Each church is different, so the process looks different for each church.

Here are the basic commitments for becoming an RIC church (Emanuel already gets to check a few things off the list).

 Your community explicitly states a welcome to people of "all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions" or "LGBTQIA+" and names its commitment to "racial equity" or "anti-racism" in its welcome statement. (Emanuel's Inclusion Statement partially mentions this)

RIC, Coat Drive, Lenten Meals/Worship

- Your community is open to calling an LGBTQIA+ and Black, Brown, Indigenous, Person of Color (BIPOC) Rostered Leader. (Emanuel has already called someone in the LGBTQIA+ community)
- 3) Your community will allow community space/ sanctuary to be used for *LGBTQIA*+ weddings and blessings. (Emanuel has already done this)
- 4) Your community will *make a meaningful contribution annually to* support the national RIC program.

Many of those who face racial injustice or are a part of the LGBTQIA+ community don't necessarily know if they will be met with resistance or welcomed in churches in our community. Reconciling Works helps bridge uncertainty by making it clear that everyone who walks through the door at Emanuel will be welcome.

"I love it when a whole classroom of middle schoolers run down the auditorium hallway for an LSI class shouting 'April!' with excitement, ready to learn about healthy relationship skills and self-esteem," said April Howe, a Program Supervisor for LSI's Clinical Services team.

Our LSI Clinical Services team provides various local community programs in schools across lowa. Whether it's mental health therapy or programs providing teen pregnancy education, they all share the goal of wrapping care around adolescents at a local level.

Specifically, April and her team conduct two community programs in nine northwest Iowa counties: Community Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention (CAPP) and Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP).

CAPP supports and educates lowa youth by providing sexual health and pregnancy prevention classes for healthy and successful relationships. PREP helps youth build social, emotional, and life skills to develop a positive sense of self and to connect with peers in their community. PREP utilizes the Teen Outreach Program and Wise Guys evidence-based curriculum.

"Thank you for teaching our class and taking time out of your day to come to our school. I learned a lot about healthy relationships and how to handle my anger and other emotions. You opened my eyes to my family's habits and what I want to take with me when I have a family of my own."

"The letters that high school students write to our staff about what they learned in class and how they will use the knowledge in their everyday life shows the programs' tremendous impact," said April. "We meet the youth where they are at, but also encourage healthy decision-making along the way, which plays a huge role in making prevention education successful."

Furthermore, April's team encourages conversation and participation by providing incentives in the classroom, such as packaged snacks and other LSI materials. "When it comes to engagement in the classroom, I always say, 'When their stomachs are full, their brains are full,'" shared April with a smile. "Some students would skip school all day, but they show up to the last class of the day, taught by LSI. That, right there, is a win for my team."

April's team has seen significant success in response to their CAPP and PREP community programs. Based on a post-program evaluation, 96% of students in the CAPP program reported that they learned "some" or "a lot" that they didn't already know about sexual health topics, and 53% agreed that they are now more likely to start conversations about these topics with others.

"Pregnancy rates have dropped over the last four years in many of our counties served, proving our services are making a difference in our communities," said April. "Reaching the youth on their level and prioritizing prevention makes our program successful."

LSI is an affiliated social ministry partner of the lowa congregations of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) and a member of LSA (Lutheran Services in America). 
