We are also limited on our bathroom space for the time being. We currently have one restroom with two stalls available on the main floor and one private bathroom upstairs.









October Food Drive

During the month of October we will be collecting items in the entryway for Our Savior's Food & Pet Food Pantry. We invite you to bring in canned or boxed goods (non-expired). We will keep a tally of what is collected each week. Our Savior's Food Pantry is open to any resident of Pottawattamie County, regardless of income.

Emanuel has had a long history of partnering with the pantry. For many years, we have collected items on a shelf in the community room and they have been taken to Our Savior's when the shelves start getting a little crowded. We have also had many members help with stocking or unloading trucks, answering their phone for appointments and help distribute items. They always welcome help, so if you have some spare time and would like to help them in in their mission, contact Josh at foodpantry@oursaviorscb.org.

In the past they have also had special events to giveaway flea and tick prevention products for pets as well as a diaper giveaway.

Council Council Minutes for September 18, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Greg Steensland

Devotions: Greg Steensland

Council Agenda:

- Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Connie
 Edson to approve the council minutes for July 2023. Approved.
- Motion by Matt Perrone, seconded by Richard Reed to approve the council minutes for August 2023. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Hipnar, seconded by Richard Reed to approve the Treasurer's report. Approved.
- Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Charles Kemmish to approve the Consolidated Fund report. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Winter, seconded by Mike Hipnar to approve the Capitol and Building Fund report. Approved.
- Motion by Char Les Kemmish, seconded by Connie Edson to approve the Memorial Fund report. Approved.
- It was reported by Richard Reed that the cost of insurance for Emanuel in the next year will go up by 30%. It is anticipated that the General Fund will be approximately \$30,000 short of disbursements for the year. It was also reported that we currently have \$719,489.54 in certificates of deposit.

- Motion by Mike Hipnar, seconded by Mike Loos to authorize pastor vacation for Sunday, October 1 and Monday October 23 through October 25 and Monday October 30 to October 31. Approved.
- Motion by Matt Perrone, seconded by Richard Reed to authorize the Society for Creative Anachronism to use the church facilities every other Sunday from October through May from 6-9 p.m. upon payment of \$100 per month and every other Tuesday from October through May upon payment of \$100 per month for total payments of \$1,200. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Loos, seconded by Mike Winter to approve the Children's and Youth report. Approved.
- Mike Hipnar reported that 11 banquet tables were purchased at a total cost of \$860 using funds raised by the garage sale.
- Char Les Kemmish gave a report from the Property Committee that the new furnace has been installed along with the air conditioner at a cost of \$13,245. The roof has been completed by Bates Roofing at a total cost as per their bid of \$24,757.60. The water leak in the parsonage has been repaired at a cost of \$288.
- Motion by Mike Winter, seconded by Richard Reed to form a Safety and Security Committee with Matt Solon to chair the committee. Approved.
- Mike Loos reported that the annual golf outing will be on October 1 at 1 p.m. as a 9 hole event.
- Char Les Kemmish will do the devotions for the October 16 meeting.
- Motion by Mike Loos, seconded by Connie Edson to adjourn at 7:57 p.m. Approved.




