Connecting Through Communion

I first volunteered, at my home church, to be a member of an altar team in the early 90s. One of my duties as an altar team member was setting up for Holy Communion each week. Over the years setting up and serving Holy Communion has become an important part of my spiritual connection. It really is a spiritual experience for me.

When setting up Holy Communion I generally have a conversation with God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Holy Communion is our chance to come to the table with all the saints before. So while I am setting the table I often find myself thanking Jesus for his amazing sacrifice so that we can all gather at the table. I thank God for His love and mercy and for sending His Son to save us all. I also communicate with the Holy Spirit. I ask that she be present with us and that she move in and around the hearts of those in our building... reconciling us to those we hold resentments against and becoming honest about our lives.

Holy Communion preparation isn't just volunteer work for me, it is a way to reconnect with the Saints as well! I love many who have left this earth—my father, grandparents, cousins and friends that I love as well.

When I set up Communion, I will often have a mental chat with one or both of my grandmothers. Both left a lasting impression on my life and helped form my faith practices. For the last 20 years I have also "chatted" with my beloved father. I share a love of children (both grade school kiddos and Middle School and

High School youth) with my dad. Often, I will tell him about the young adults I am mentoring or confirmation class escapades, knowing he would be laughing right along with me.

Then there is the serving of Holy Communion! If you have not considered serving Holy Communion, I STRONGLY encourage you to consider it. For me it is a high honor and a faith practice that reinforces my love for Jesus as well as my fellow humans. Serving Holy Communion, I can almost hear my family coming to the table, and often I will sense their presence as if they, too, are standing at the front of the church sharing a Holy Meal with our brothers and sisters!

Holy Communion is my chance to stand at the altar and catch a glimpse of the Kingdom coming to earth!


Thanksgiving Baskets

(From a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear friends in Christ,

We are in the season of gratitude lists, Thanksgiving baskets and pumpkin-flavored everything. So let me add to the litany of thanks. Brenda and I want to offer our heartfelt thanks for the wonderful recognition we received on October 14 for Pastor Appreciation

Month. We loved and are enjoying your gifts of food and fun. We feel deeply loved and appreciated here at Emanuel Lutheran Church. Thank you so very much.

I was a bit tongue-tied as I came into the Community Room and saw the concrete expression of your generous appreciation. We are richly blessed to be part of the mission and ministry here at Emanuel. Ours is a wonderful church family, and you work hard to remind us that you value us as people and as partners in witness and service. Thank you again for your care and support.

Part of my verbal stumbling that Sunday was a natural response we have to generosity. When we take in the fullness of our blessings, we can be left speechless. If you are like me, you'd rather be on the giving end of things than the receiving end. Receiving can make us feel vulnerable and a little bit out of control. We often resist that experience. But real joy comes when we embrace it.

The Children and Youth Committees orchestrated the appreciation effort. As it happened, I was unable to attend the monthly meeting of those committees, so they could make their plans unhindered. We realized after the fact that others had been making plans about us. When we know that, we can feel a bit uncomfortable. But again, the real joy comes when we allow that sort of thing to happen to us.

Why do I belabor all this? Because this is how it works with God as well. We are on the receiving end of God's great mercy. God is the Maker. All things belong to God. All that we have comes from God. The only healthy and happy response is joyful gratitude to God. God makes plans to bless us and tends not to let us in on how this all works out. Sometimes in retrospect we can see how those plans came together. Sometimes we can't. But we can be sure that God is always working for our good through the grace of Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Real joy comes when we gratefully accept what God gives us. Real joy comes when we allow God to lead us into a life of blessing, whether we understand how it all works or not. And real joy comes when we put to good use for God all that we have been given. That's what stewardship really is.

I hope you will embrace the opportunity to know this grateful joy. Daycare Construction Committee Timeline

(As of October 14, 2018)

The Emanuel Lutheran Church Daycare Construction Committee has been meeting regularly over the past several months. The Daycare plans are in the final stage (see large colored plan on the display board in the Fellowship Hall). At the most recent meeting, the committee discussed the following.




tion by December 2, 2018. The backup date for a special congregational meeting may be January 6, 2019

 Roger Doehling, the architect on the project, will be available December 9, 2018 during coffee hour to answer any questions regarding the project.

- New HVAC system for the offices.
 Each of the four (converted from the current three) offices will have a ceiling mounted unit. Estimated cost is \$20,000.
- Drainage from each new classroom door (2) to the outside yard should run under the parking lot to the creek, for efficiency and ease of maintenance.
- Bid invitations will be sent to a limited number (4-6) of prospective general contractors on November 1, 2018 with bids to be submitted/returned no later than November 29, 2018. A walk-though of the facility with interested contractors will be scheduled between November 1-28. The walk-through will be coordinated between Roger, the committee and the church office.
- The Daycare Construction Committee will meet November 29, 2018 to review the bids, and make a recommendation regarding which bid to move forward. The committee will make a formal recommendation to the Church Council.
- The Daycare Construction Committee recommends scheduling a special congregational meeting for December 16, 2018 following the children's Christmas program. The meeting will be to vote on whether to accept the construction bid recommended by the committee. Information regarding the Construction Committee's recommendation, and notice of the special congregational meeting, will be made available to the congrega-

- The classrooms will require items be removed prior to the start of the project. The committee will coordinate removing items with Michaela Lewis and Deann Over.
- The committee was made aware the Council Bluffs Fire Marshall has requested quilting materials be moved out of the furnace storage room. This will aid in preparing to move Cindy Richard's office to the current cry room. The committee discussed adding a door between Cindy's new office and the Worship Center (sanctuary).
- Roger Doehling needs information regarding the church's insurance coverage, to see what our current policy covers and does not cover for damages and liability related to construction remodeling projects. Roger needs our specific coverages and limitations.
- John Burns has reviewed draft contract proposals, and has no objections to using the AIA form 104. John recommends if issues arise regarding terms and conditions of the contract, and its various supplements and terms, that independent counsel be hired, or another attorney review.
- The Daycare Construction Committee will next meet Tuesday, October 23 at 6:00 p.m.

Mental Health Awareness

This month I wanted to share with you something that has been shared at our Mental Health meetings. This is called How to Love Yourself. There are 10 steps to walk through for this. We find it to be a great tool for every day use. We suggest that you tape this to a mirror or anything you will see daily.

How to Love Yourself

- **Stop All Criticism** Criticism never changes a thing. Refuse to criticize yourself. Accept yourself exactly as you are. Everybody changes. When you criticize yourself, your changes are negative. When you approve yourself, your changes are positive.
- **Don't Scare Yourself** Stop terrorizing yourself with thoughts. It's a dreadful way to live. Find a mental image that gives you pleasure and immediately switch your scary thoughts to a pleasure thought.
- **Be Gentle and Kind and Patient** Be gentle with yourself. Be kind to yourself. Be patient with yourself as you learn new ways of thinking. Treat yourself as you would someone you really love.
- **Be Kind to Your Mind-** Self-hatred is only hating your own thoughts. Don't hate yourself for having thoughts. Gently change your thoughts.
- **Praise Yourself-** Criticism breaks down the inner spirit. Praise builds it up. Praise yourself as much as you can.
- **Support Yourself** Find ways to support yourself. Reach out to friends and allow them to help you.
- **Be Loving to Your Negatives** Acknowledge that you created them to fulfill a need. Now, you are finding a new, positive way to fulfill those needs.
- **Take Care of Your Body** Learn about nutrition and exercise. Cherish and revere the temple you live in.
- **Mirror Work** Look into your eyes often. Forgive yourself while looking in the mirror. Forgive others while looking into the mirror. At least once a day look in the mirror and say "I love you. I really love you."

Love Yourself- Begin today. Do the best you can Doing your best is always good enough.

I want to remind everyone that we hold Mental Health Awareness meetings on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month. <u>EVERYONE</u> is welcome. We are a <u>SAFE</u> place to learn and share, or just listen. The 1st Sunday is normally discussion and sharing. The 3rd Sunday is reserved for a speaker. We have had a few wonderful speakers so far and we are only starting to scratch the surface of what the community has to offer.

has been a membership transfer of Karen Smith from Thomas Lutheran in Omaha. Motion by John Spilde, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to approve the transfer. Approved. There will be a new members reception Sunday, December 9, 2018 that will also include Nick Rickard, Shelby Rickard and Nikki Rickard. Pastor also reported that the Western Iowa Synod Assembly in Sioux City will be from May 3-5, 2019. A Bishop will be elected. Recommendations were also made for confirmation Sunday, November 4, 2018 for Lauren Hansen, Kylie Hansen, Alexxia Richards, Xander Richards, Owen Hansen, Andrew Borwick, Austin Borwick, Josh Hubbard, Tyler Steensland, Aaralynn Conley, She Nickels and Shelby Rickard. Motion by Judi Malloy, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to approve those recommendations. Approved.

- The Stewardship Committee Drive is in the planning stage. Budget documents have been forwarded to all committee heads with the request to have them back to the committee by December 9, 2018. A Stewardship Dinner is planned for November 11, 2018 and a clipboard will be passed around in services for families to sign up.

money goes. But the fund is started. Let's get that seed growing!




It takes quite a bit to put on a concert. There are artist fees, additional band members fees, rooms and meals costs, and advertising costs. It all adds up.


