Periodic Pastoral Ponderings

(From a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear friends in Christ,

I am so excited by our fall stewardship theme, “On the Verge.” It really captures where Emanuel Lutheran Church is at this stage of our journey together. We are right on the edge of another generation of great mission and service here. Worship attendance is up. Our Wednesday evening programming has great potential. We are getting close to some real proposals about a congregational day care. Adult education is growing. Prospective members are joining. Longtime members are returning. We have two dozen youth who attend events and activities regularly. It seems like things are ready to “pop”!



Or are they? If we relax in our efforts, we are “on the verge” of returning to a declining and dwindling congregation. We have restored our mission and service to levels of about twelve years ago—about the time when decline and distress really took hold. We have much more work to do. If we do not continue to press forward, in a few years we will return to the near-death state that existed here in 2012.

I don’t want to be an alarmist, but I want to be realistic. We need your energy. We need your prayers. And we need your dollars. Offerings so far this year are well below the same time a year ago. That is in spite of continued growth in every other area. I find that discouraging and, at times, demoralizing. Now is the time to step up and keep the faith promises you made a year ago. And it is time to do even more so the growth can continue.



The future is bright with promise. I see a congregation in a few years with a flourishing church daycare serving lots of families—many of whom might become part of our church family. I see a midweek program of community, worship, children’s activities and adult education that is growing by leaps and bounds. I see a youth program that invites new young people into fellowship and education. I see even more community service than we have now.

Emanuel Lutheran Church is “on the verge.” Will the result be the next generation of mission and service or a retreat into decline and distress? That is up to us, right here and right now. I know what God wants for Emanuel Lutheran Church. I find it in the words of Ephesians 3:20-21—“*Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen.*”

God wants to accomplish in and through us far more than we can ask or imagine. Let’s make this congregation one that gives glory to God in Jesus. We are “on the verge” of the next great generation of mission and service here. Will you be part of that future here and now?



Following opening interative liturgy from the Women of the ELCA Resource Booklet regarding missions, Carol Jeppesen read scriptures regarding missions: Acts 11:15-18; 1 Cor 1:2-10; Galations 3:26-29. After comments regarding these scriptures, a blessing and prayer were given. The business meeting was conducted with appropriate approvals made of the secretary's and treasurer's report.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by President Kevin Epperson.

Council Agenda:

- Kim Egnor gave an updated presentation on the Daycare Feasibility Study to council members, with input from members of the Daycare Feasibility Study Group. Discussion included required architectural changes to church property, projected expenses including start-up costs and ongoing operational expenses, along with financial funding options available. The Group provided council members with materials for review and discussion. Council members asked the Daycare Feasibility Study Group to consider forum presentations to the congregation during coffee hour one Sunday in November, as well as on a Wednesday evening. Council will review and further discuss the information at the November council meeting.

When William "Big Bill" Hogan was 16, he yearned to be a chef. Working in a number of restaurants over the past 30 years, his experience fostered a calling to serve people facing hunger. When he saw restaurants throwing away hundreds of pounds of food each night, he asked if he could have it to feed hungry neighbors out of his apartment. With food in hand, Bill began serving.

Members of Galilee Lutheran Church in Roseville, Minn., took notice and today Help for the 'Hood, a meal ministry, is part of Galilee's outreach to neighbors who go hungry, especially at the end of the month when resources for food become scarce. The ministry has become especially important during the summer when school-aged children are home.

"After 30 years in the food business, I'd rather have a ministry than a restaurant," Bill said. "Giving back feels good."

Students ages 11-18 help prepare and serve meals and acquire jobs skills along the way. Bill mentors the students and teaches them about the basics of running a small business and the importance of money management. The students also receive a stipend for their work.

Ler Say, 14, is one of the young members of his staff. Born in Burma, he helps cook, serve food and clean up the free lunchtime meals.

"It's heartwarming to help people out," Ler says. "This is a really good job with good people, and we make a brighter future for everyone. It's good job training experience for me, too."

When his little sister was born, things started to change for Jaimee.

His mom, Jaymee, noticed he began to act out more, and she was afraid he felt neglected while everyone focused on the new baby. He struggled to stay focused in school, he never wanted to get out of bed in the morning, and he often became frustrated.

But after working with LSI's Behavioral Health Intervention Services, six-year-old Jaimee is creating a stronger, loving bond with his siblings and his mom.

Jaimee began meeting with his BHIS worker, Jose. When the duo first met, Jaimee was quiet and reserved, and he would get frustrated with the new games Jose brought to play with him.

Jaimee, his mom, and Jose now play games every week as a way to teach Jaimee to stay focused for longer periods of time. But Jaimee is learning how to use more than games to make each day better.

Jose is teaching Jaimee new songs to help him stay calm in stressful situations. When it's time to get up every morning, he sings a song to help him wake up and start the day.

"Now he has songs he can use to get him through the day," Jose says. "He's a charming boy to work with. He's a hard worker, and he's come a long way." When he's not spending time watching his favorite movies, Jaimee has started playing more sports at home with his cousins. He especially loves to wrestle any time he can.

"It's all about the baby steps," Jose says. "What might be a really small thing for him can be a really huge change."

Ramblings from the Back Corner

We are currently using “Now the Feast and Celebration” for our liturgy on our more formal first and third Sundays (and special days). This communion liturgy was written in by Marty Haugen in collaboration with then campus pastors at Pacific Lutheran University Susan Briehl, Dan Erlander and Martin Wells. It was commissioned by the Campus Ministry Department of Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington. To give a more thorough insight into it’s creation I quote the introduction in the keyboard score, written by Marty Haugen June 3, 1990.

(albeit slowly), adapting in its elements, style and language, in a constant tension between the renewal and preservation of Christian tradition. As part of this long, evolving stream of Christian worship, we need to continually critique and examine our worship traditions, even as we seek to defend their integrity and vitality as celebrations of the heart of our faith.

“Settings of service music provide the ‘backbone’ of worship for a community, a relatively unchanging experience in contrast to the hymns and psalms. This stability is an integral part of ritual, and we grow in faith precisely through the experience of a repetitive rhythm of our prayer in common. At the same time, it is critical that we understand that the way Christians have prayed through the centuries has evolved

This particular setting is suggested as an ‘alternate’ setting, for it presumes that a community already has such a backbone of service music. It is my hope that this setting would help members of a community grow in their vision of worship, first through hearing new texts and music, and perhaps then hearing their established texts and music with new ears.”

Let it open our ears, minds, and hearts to what this liturgy can reveal to us.
