Dear friends in Christ,

Emanuel is the most welcoming congregation I know. Now it's time to become the most inviting congregation as well.

"Welcoming" is a wonderful thing. People come in the door and are met with smiles, conversation, encouragement and acceptance. We do the welcoming thing very well indeed. If we limit ourselves to welcoming, however, we will only connect with those brave folks who take the first (really, really big) step to come into a strange place and risk rejection. They don't know how welcoming we are until after they arrive. Most people won't take that chance on their own.

Welcoming is a passive strategy. "Inviting" is an active strategy. We are coming into a time of the church year when the chances to invite are many. Please invite family, friends, neighbors, co-workers and fellow students to our Holy Week and Easter worship services at the end of the month. Many people will be looking for a place to worship at that time. Do you care enough for these folks to help them out?

Please invite family, friends, neighbors, co-workers and fellow students to our Lenten midweek meals and services. You know how fulfilling those experiences are (from food to prayer to fellowship to worship). Why would we keep these services a secret?

Our young people do a great job of inviting friends to events and activities here. Our spring middle school lock-in is scheduled for March 24th from 8 p.m. to 12 a.m. Our Kidz Kamp program during Lent is fun and filled with prayer-learning!

You might think that everyone you know is already involved in a church (at least if that's what they want). Repeated surveys demonstrate that this is not the case. Fifty percent of people would consider checking out a church event IF SOMEONE WOULD JUST ASK THEM. If everyone you know is already involved in a church, then it's time to expand your circle of acquaintances!

Our God is the God who seeks us out. That's who Jesus is—the human face of the God who will not sit back and wait for us to respond. The Church is called to be a seeking community. We dare not be content with sitting back and waiting for people to show up. Welcoming is a lovely thing. But it's not worth much unless we invite people to enjoy our wonderful welcome.

Share our blessed Easter time with someone who longs to know God better!

Helping Others Through The Food Pantry

Food & Pet Food Pantry

For many years Emanuel has been very generous in supporting Our Savior"s Food and Pet Pantry. Your monetary and food donations are greatly needed and appreciated. The need for this ministry has grown immensely in the last few years. In 2015 they served 5,105 people, an increase of 575 over the year before. The Pet Pantry served 3,971 dogs and cats, an increase of 141 since 2014. There are already indications that the need will be even greater in 2016. The Food Pantry is now open on Thursday from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. and on the 4th Friday evening from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. The people at Our Savior's feel that it needs to open one more evening a week. They have wonderful volunteers but to open another evening would require more volunteers. They are asking Emanuel to help make that happen. There are a number of things one can do as a volunteer.

- 1. Storage Assistant and Stocker move and sort boxes of food, organize and stock food on shelves. This is more physically demanding and you need to be able to lift 50 pounds.
- 2. Distribution Assistant Bringing filled carts to the lobby and assisting clients to their cars. May also assist in stocking food shelves.
- 3. Interviewer Keep track of the number of people we serve. This position requires accuracy, speed, friendliness, and discretion. This role sets the tone and pace of service in the pantry.
- 4. Pet Food Pantry Breakdown larger bags of dry dog/cat food into large zip lock bags. This is heavy work and one must be able to lift 50 pounds.
- 5. Answer Phones Answer phones to make client appointments, taking down their name, number of people they are requesting food for, ages of children if any, number, size and kind of pets.

There will be information about who to contact and how to apply to be a volunteer at church or you can call me at 712 328-9093.

Another statistic I want to share with you is that for every \$10 you donate \$100 worth of food is provided to hungry families. The reason for this is the Food Pantry can buy food from the Food Bank to supplement donations at a low cost.

We all know of times when either we or someone we know has found themselves in a difficult situation and have had a hard time feeding their families. We know that no one can function well without adequate nutrition. Children are especially at risk without the proper building blocks for growth and development.

Our Savior's, our sister church, feels the need to expand their program and has asked for our help. I hope you will prayerfully consider how you can be a part of that expansion, whether by giving more food items, monetary donations, or giving of your time. One of the teachings of Jesus is to feed the hungry. Whatever way you take part in this mission, your contribution will be multiplied many times over. We at Emanuel have so much to be thankful for and sharing our blessings with others is a way of thanking God for being so blest.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Kevin Epperson.

Devotions: Mike Winter

Council Agenda:

Council members introduced one another and told the other members a little bit about themselves. Motion by Oscar Over, seconded by Bob Vergamini, to approve the minutes of the meeting of January 12, 2016. Approved.

Oscar Over moved and Peggy Jarrell seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the annual meeting held on January 24, 2016. Approved.

Motion made by Oscar Over, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the minutes of the special congregational meeting held January 24, 2016. Approved.

Motion by Oscar Over, seconded by Judi Malloy to approve the minutes of the special council meeting held on January 24, 2016. Approved.

Motion by Oscar Over, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the consolidated fund report. Approved. Motion made by Oscar Over, seconded by Judi Malloy to approve the Treasurer's Report. Approved.

Motion made by Oscar Over, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the Capital Fund Report. Approved

Motion made by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to approve the Memorial Fund Report. Approved.

Pastor's written report was submitted. Among the 15 points raised by the report were the following:

1. Pastor attached a copy of an article from the Nonpareil concerning construction by Bethany Lutheran Home on the property south of the church. Church member Ken Kemmish is on the Bethany

Board of Directors. It was discussed on how we might want to dialogue with the folks at Bethany about how Emanuel and Bethany can partner together in helpful ways in light of the new facility. It was pointed out that there is no tie in to the church for any roadway.

- 2. Pastor attached notes from the recent informal meeting of those people willing to serve on the day-care feasibility study group. A report is expected in March.
- 3. Pastor advised that he attended the second round of interviews to qualify for redeveloper pastor training on February 8 at the Nebraska Synod Office. He has registered for the training in February in Indianapolis.
- 4. Pastor continues to meet periodically with Father Aaron Hudson of St. Paul's Episcopal Church and reminded us that we are invited to a get acquainted potluck at St. Paul's from 5-7 p.m. on Sunday, March 13.

Motion made by John Husmann, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to appoint a committee to conduct the daycare feasibility study group to be headed by Kim Egner. Approved. Members include Amy Steensland, Michaela Lewis, Mike and Carla Hipnar, Jamie Hansen, John and Barb Burns and Lowell Hennigs.

Judi Malloy reported that Our Savior wants someone to join them in supporting their food pantry.

It was reported that 130 persons attended Mardi Gras including some people from the Phoenix House.

John Husmann reported that the annual ping pong tournament will be held on February 27 and 28.

Wider Ministries reported that the next Joyful Noise will be in support of the food pantry at Our Savior's Lutheran Church.

Bob Vergamini reported that his wife Linda has received two silver beaver awards from the Boy Scouts District and that his wife Linda will volunteer to be the charter organization representative to serve as a liaison link between the troop and Emanuel. Oscar Over moved and Suzanne Winter seconded a motion to appoint Linda Vergamini as the charter organization representative of Emanuel to serve as the liaison with Troop 550. Approved.

It was reported that Linda Martins retired as the church nurse and that our new church nurse will be Chasity Christie.

We were reminded that council members need to be on at least one church committee.

The Synod Leadership Academy will be held in Atlantic, Iowa on February 27 and at least four church members will attend including Michaela Lewis, Judi Malloy, Brenda Hennigs and Cindy Richards.

Oscar has drafted some proposed documents regarding the use of the facilities and grounds and regarding a policy concerning the same and agreement

forms and requested the council members to review the same so that they can be discussed at the March meeting.

Motion was made, seconded and approved to allow Girl Scout Troop 40006 to meet at the church Tuesdays at 5:30 p.m.
