Dear friends in Christ,

You may have noticed on recent calendar announcements the notation, "FAITH Team meeting." What is the FAITH Team? This is the name of the team that is overseeing the redevelopment and renewal process here at Emanuel Lutheran Church.

The team was selected by the Church Council after several months of deliberation. The Emanuel Renewal (FAITH) team met the first time on May 22. Members of the team include Mike Hipnar, Judy Heithoff, Jan Stone, Tyler Hansen, Chris Sorensen and Alan Ellis. I serve as facilitator and resource for the team.

The team is working to oversee and coordinate our efforts as a congregation to move into the next generation of ministry and mission here at Emanuel Lutheran Church. In the short term, that work will involve getting acquainted with the task and with one another.

That work will also involve helping to prepare an application for ELCA grant support for our upcoming day-care mission project. I will take the lead on that task, but team input will be critical. That work will also involve engaging the congregation in a "Congregation Health Survey" to create a baseline of information for future projects and visions.

After that, we will see where this takes us. The FAITH team will prepare the congregation to move into the next generation of healthy and flourishing mission and service here at Emanuel Lutheran Church.

The team is also and always looking for LHF ("low-hanging fruit"). In response to input from the FAITH team, for example, we now have a Guest Wifi network here at Emanuel. It is available to users here and is separate from our office Wifi network. We will be looking for additional ways to expand and enhance our mission and service here. Watch the newsletter and announcements for regular updates.

Mark your calendars on Saturday, August 5, at 6:30 p.m., for a concert you won't want to miss. Rachel Kurtz will perform at Bayliss Park in a free concert sponsored by Emanuel Lutheran Church. There is no admission charge for the event. A free-will offering will be received to help with the costs of sending Emanuel youth to the next ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston in the summer of 2018.

Rachel Kurtz is a Minneapolis-based songwriter, performer and recording artist. Churches across the country have discovered Rachel's powerhouse voice and joyful presence thanks to her relentless touring schedule, and her featured appearances on the main stage of recent national youth gathering. Her song "Make A Difference," unveiled at the 2012 ELCA Youth Gathering, has become a widespread sensation sung by praise bands, youth groups, and school choirs from coast to coast. Rachel has participated in benefit concert tours across the country with fellow musicians Agapé and Lost And Found, helping to raise \$125,000 for ELCA World Hunger. In addition to her music leadership at conventions and congre-



gations, Rachel is also an in-demand retreat facilitator and keynote speaker at youth weekends, women's retreats and many times at Sunday morning worship. Rachel is an incredible singer/songwriter with a beautiful voice and an amazing story. Rachel shares personal testimonies of tragedy and triumph with a vulnerability that captivates her audience. She has performed at the last three ELCA Youth Gatherings and has had the opportunity to travel to Africa, Germany and India with her music ministry. She has a strong desire to make a difference in the world through her music and a passion for global justice.

Youth Summer Mission Trip Serves at Angel Tree Camp

A group of Emanuel youth and adults will have the chance to work for a four days this summer at an Angel Tree Camp. This camp serves children who have a parent in jail or in prison. The group will work alongside the highly trained and experienced full time staff as volunteer staff with children from grade one through five. The mission trippers will serve at the Angel Tree Camp near Eldora Iowa from 5 p.m. on Sunday afternoon, July 23rd, through Friday evening, July 28th.



The cost for the week is \$200 for the camp plus spending money for a day at Adventureland on Friday. Participants will use funds from youth accounts, raise some funds between now and then, and contribute some of the costs out of pocket.

Our young people will provide care and attention to the campers under the supervision of experienced adult leaders. And it's CAMP! Activities will include swimming, hiking, fishing, crafts, music, worship, games and cabin life. Our young people will be working during the week, but it's CAMP! A workday at camp is better than most days doing other things.

The Angel Tree camp concludes at noon on Thursday, July 27th. That afternoon the group will travel to near Pella, Iowa, to tour and enjoy the soon-to-be completed permanent home for the Angel Tree camps. They will stay at the camp near Pella that night and then spend most of Friday at Adventureland in Altoona. The group will plan to be home before 9 p.m. that night. We will work with the folks at Adventureland to get a church group admission rate for the day.

This is an opportunity for one or more additional adults to come along as chaperones and drivers. Adults will not be sleeping in the cabins and will thus have more comfortable accommodations. BUT EVEN THE CABINS ARE AIR-CONDITIONED!

Our young people can bring friends along as well, if the friends are willing to pay their way and/or assist with fundraising. This is a great opportunity to serve in a deeply meaningful way and a fantastic way to live out our faith. The youth of Emanuel thank you all for your prayers and support as our young people seek to serve faithfully and with the love of Christ.
