(From a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear partners in the Gospel,

It is time to remember our theme verse for 2016: "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (1 Corinthians 12:7). We are giving thanks to God for sending us gifts for mission and service through the power of the Holy Spirit.

We are spending time this year exploring how the Spirit is gifting Emanuel Lutheran Church for mission and service. During Epiphany, we explored those gifts in our congregation filled with wonderfully gifted disciples. As we explored those gifts, we asked ourselves, "To what are we being called through these gifts?"

During Lent we learned more about the gift of prayer, and we appreciated the gift of the Psalms to the Church. In Easter we have celebrated the gift of new life through Jesus. We have been emphasized the "new" part of that theme. We have learned new songs in worship. We have moved the sanctuary furniture around. We are collecting the most interesting ideas we can discover and trying things out in worship and service. We are having several baptisms. And we are receiving new members.

In addition, we are exploring new modes of ministry. We have heard from our Daycare Feasibility Study Work Group about church-based daycare as a new way to serve our neighborhood and community. I was moved by my participation in the Easter Vigil at St. Paul's and am grateful for these friendships.

In the long season of Pentecost, we will explore some of the most important gifts given to the Church—the gifts of faith, hope and love. We will explore the gift of faith as we read selections from Paul's letter to the Galatians in June. We will celebrate the gift of hope as we read selections for Paul's letter to the Colossians in July. We will appreciate the gift of love as we return to Luke's gospel in August and beyond.

It is my prayer that our experience of the Holy Spirit's power will grow and deepen as we make this journey together. Thank you for sharing your marvelous gifts for our common mission and service here!

Midweek Worship Moves Outdoors

Weather permitting, our Wednesday evening worship services will move out to our south patio beginning May 18. We will continue to have our free suppers at 6:15 followed by informal worship at 7:00 p.m. Some of our suppers will certainly involve grilling outdoors! Please bring

lawn chairs for the outdoor services if you have them. This will reduce the amount of setup and tear-down time needed for the services. Worship includes contemporary and familiar music, an interactive teaching message, prayers and Holy Communion (by intinction). We are currently reading through Paul's letter to the Ephesians at this service and using those verses for activities, conversation and reflection. Invite your friends and neighbors!

When should I call my pastor?

It's not always clear to folks when it might be a good idea to call their pastor. But there are many times when this could be helpful. Here are some suggestions.

- When you're going into the hospital.
 Please tell your pastor when you going into the hospital, or if a family member is. Your pastor likes to visit people who are in the hospital for a few days or more. He'll bring you or your family member God's words of comfort.
- When you have experienced the loss of a friend or loved one (including pets).
- When you would like a prayer said for you. Your pastor is always happy to do this.
- When you are not able to come to church for more than a month. If you are sick for a prolonged period of time or recovering from illness or surgery and can't get to church, your pastor will come to you. He will see how you are doing, pray with you, and bring you the Lord's Supper.
- When you have a question or concern about something at church. Many churchrelated questions that people have can be cleared up easily. Likewise, if you have a concern about something at church, let your pastor know and he'll see what he can do to resolve it. Or if you have a suggestion for something that can be done that is new or different, tell your pastor. Your pastor will not be able to implement every suggestion, but your input does matter!
- When you have a personal, spiritual or family concern that is unresolved after one month. If an issue in does not go away after one month, then it is probably not going to go away without some help. Pastoral counseling will focus on spiritual issues. Your pastor is not a professional counselor. But he is able to apply God's powerful Word to your life.

- When your conscience is troubling you and you want assurance of God's grace. God does not leave us alone to struggle with temptation and guilt. God invites us to confess our sin and receive God's forgiveness. In strict confidence you can confess your sin to your pastor and receive assurance of God's forgiveness and absolution delivered personally to you. You are welcome to come even if no particular sin is troubling you. It's faith-building to receive God's forgiveness at any time.
- When you are wrestling with a spiritual issue or have a question about something the Bible says. Call your pastor if you have a question about a Bible teaching. Talk with him about it. If you encounter something in a sermon, Bible study, or in your own personal Bible reading that makes you scratch your head, let your pastor know. Your pastor loves to discuss God's Word and to see people grow in their understanding of it.
- When you have a friend or relative who wants to know more about Jesus. Please pass their names on to your pastor.

This is not a complete list. But it will help you to think about the times when calling your pastor would be helpful. And if calling doesn't work for you, Pastor Hennigs' email address is emanpas1@gmail.com. You can also chat with him or message him on Facebook.

Thank you so much for always being so generous and caring. All of you are a blessing to our church family, our community and God's people in need. Here are a few of our current projects through wider Ministries.

Hope Net Ministries

Our Joyful Noise Offering for May is for Hope Net Ministries, Inc. and it will be on May 22. Hope Net Ministries serves women coming out of prison and drug and alcohol rehab. They operate two second hand stores in Council Bluffs called Sequels. Whether you donate items there or shop there you are contributing to this ministry.

ServeFest Volunteers

Suzanne Winter has distributed materials about ServFest on May 14. This is an opportunity for churches to take part in a city wide clean up. If you want to participate and haven't signed up, please do so soon so they have enough T-shirts for everyone. There are flyers at church or you can call Suzanne if you have questions. This is a way to serve our neighbors and community. Some of us will be working with our neighborhood association at Kimball Park.

Fruit/Veggies from Tomato Tomato

I have information available about a CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) called Tomato Tomato. This is an opportunity to get fresh fruits and vegetables every week all summer by buying a share or a half share. You can learn more by going to their web site - www.tomatotomato.org. or you can call them at 402 933-0893. These foods are locally grown and come to you fresh. They also have joined VNA and No More Empty Pots to present free cooking classes 1 evening a week for 6 weeks during the summer. The dates have not been announced yet but they will be posted at church when they are available.

Donations

Glasses & Hearing Aid Donations

All of you know that we continue to collect eye glasses for the Lion's Club but do you know that they also can make use of used hearing aids? If you have any you would like to donate, put them in the box with the glasses. New hearing aids are extremely expensive but are necessary for many people to live a full life. Being able to refurbish unused hearing aids and distributing them to those who cannot afford new ones is a great way to help many people.

Assistants for MMHC Dinners

Several members of our committee helped St. Paul's Episcopalian Church serve a dinner for MMHC. This is a church group of mentally disabled adults who meet on Tuesday evenings. When there is a fifth Tuesday in the month, they have a dinner at St. Paul's. So far members of our committee have assisted with the dinner but if any of you would like to participate, please call me. It's a great opportunity to serve God's people and become acquainted with our friends at St. Paul's.

Volunteers for Food Pantry

We are moving forward in our project to help Our Savior's Food and Pet Food Pantry expand their hours. They need 10 volunteers to expand to the second Friday of the month from 5-7 pm. Seven signed up on Sunday. If you weren't there and you would like to help, please call me. Volunteers will need to spend a little time shadowing the volunteers on a Thursday morning or the fourth Friday evening before they start the second Friday distribution. Duties of the volunteers were listed in last month's newsletter or you can get the information from me. The expanded hours are

greatly needed because the number of people in need of this service continues to grow.

Recently we have been using "Lord, Listen to your Children Praying" as a response during the prayers of intersession. It was written by Ken Medema. Here's what the From the Hymnal Companion has to say about it.





April 24

"Ken Medema (b. December 7, 1943) recorded this song on his album Son Shiny Day (1973) and published it in the songbook that went with the recording. He wrote it in New Jersey in 1970 when he was working with a youth group there. Here is how it took shape:

We started talking about a young man who was in the hospital and who really needed our prayers. In the middle of our prayer time, the idea for this little chorus came to me. I started humming, then singing. Soon the kids were mumbling along with me. We sang that chorus, "Lord, listen to your children praying," several times over. Then I started adding verses, and the kids quickly joined me in singing the new words. So it was a song born out of our concern and prayer for a friend.

Kenneth Peter Medema was born in Grand Rapids. Blind from

birth, he showed an aptitude for music. After studying in the Christian schools of Grand Rapids, he went to Michigan State University and studied voice, piano, and music theory. He became a music therapist in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and Cedar Grove, New Jersey. In 1973 he began a concert career. He has toured throughout the United States and Canada and includes his ability as an improviser in his concerts. In 1985 he started his own recording, publishing, and booking company called Briar Patch Music. In 1998 Huntington College in Huntington, Illinois, gave him an honorary doctorate. He and his wife, Jane, have a son and a daughter."


