Good morning to my Emanuel family and friends

By the time you read this we'll be close to the season of Advent when we await the coming of Christ with hope? What do those words mean? I was always told in college when writing papers and completing exams to always define my terms. For me, this season here's how I personally mean when I say I'm awaiting the coming of Christ with hope.

For starters, I have found opportunity for lots of hopeful waiting with my parents and particularly their health. To those of you I haven't had the opportunity to share with, my parents are aging and the time has come in their life when they are needing more care. My sister and I have been thrust into the world of long term care receiving a crash course on Medicare, Medicaid, social security, and the like. At times it's been overwhelming—the role reversal of now caring for my parents came unexpectedly. But it's also surprisingly been a time of reconciliation. My mother and I have had a strained relationship for most of my life. Now she's been so loving and sweet and I enjoy spending time with her. At the same time it's so hard to see how much she's changed physically and become so dependent on other people. My awaiting the coming of Christ with hope when it comes to my parents looks like finally getting the paperwork filled out for long term health care in the home and having the peace of mind that they're being well cared for and looked after.


It's having hope that Derek will grow into a confident and capable young man and find work that gives him satisfaction and purpose and will find someone to love and share his days with. It's just wanting my brother to get his life together enough to see to him getting the medical care he needs.

As I'm writing this I've had one of those days...you know the ones. Where you wish you could crawl back into bed and start them all over again—do things differently. Those days that leave you rattled and feeling just a titch off center.

Those days where you feel overwhelmed, harried, and frazzled. Then something inside of my gently says, why don't you try prayer? So I take a moment and close my eyes and a short simple prayer pours out—thank you God, be with me, help.

That's the short and simple of it, awaiting the coming of Christ with hope—calling out and trusting that Christ is there, with me in the messiness of my life, the worries, the exhaustion, the sudden change, the suprising blessings, and that together we're going to get through this.

order online from several retailers.


Blue Christmas Service

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by President Greg Steensland

Devotions: Mike Hipnar

Council Agenda:

- Motion by Mike Hipnar, seconded by Richard Reed to approve the council minutes for October 16, 2023. Approved.
- Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Connie Edson to approve the Treasurer's report. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Loos, seconded by Mike Hipnar to approve the Consolidated Fund report. Approved.
- Motion by Char Les Kemmish, seconded by Connie Edson to approve the Capitol and Building Fund report. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Loos, seconded by Mike Hipnar to approve the Memorial Fund report. Approved.
- The council received the November report from Michaela Lewis. The SCA would like to change their meetings from two Sundays a month from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. to every Sunday from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Mike Loos to increase the rent charged to SCA to \$150 per month for Sundays and \$100 per month for Tuesdays. Approved.
- Discussion was held concerning updating the electronic directory and taking updated digital camera pictures of members. Motion by Mike Hipnar, seconded by Connie Edson to spend up to \$50 to purchase a back drop. Approved.
- It was agreed that the newsletter should notify members that pictures can be taken the first Sunday of February and the first Sunday of March for purposes of placing these pictures in the electronic directly.
- Discussion was held to ask members if they have a refrigerator they can donate since there is only one refrigerator in the storage room and large events may require more refrigeration space.

- Mason Lewis and Amari Johnson will be attending the Youth Gathering in New Orleans accompanied by Stephen Lewis and Cara Knutson as leaders.
- Connie Edson reported from the Wider Ministries Committee that 20 Thanksgiving boxes were prepared and picked up by 19 families. The remaining box was not picked up despite the fact that that family was notified.
- Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Mike Loos to table discussion and payment of the estimate from A Raymond Plumbing, Inc. asking to provide more specific information. Approved.
- Motion by Matt Perrone, seconded by Char Les Kemmish to approve the payment to Olson Brothers Construction Company in the amount of \$6,673 to be paid from the Noran Davis Estate. Approved.
- Char Les Kemmish provided a maintenance list to be discussed at the December meeting to address responsibilities for those items listed on the maintenance list and to allow council members to add to that list.
- Motion by Mike Hipnar, seconded by Mike Loos to pay \$15 an hour to a person to maintain the upper and lower sidewalks removing snow and ice. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Winter, seconded by Mike Hipnar to approve pastor vacation days for December 27 to December 31, which includes one Sunday on December 31 when Pastor Stephany will lead services. Approved.
- Pastor reported that the Christmas Eve service on December 24 will be a morning service at 9:30 a.m. oriented to families and children with a special Christmas story for the sermon and audience participation. The evening service at 7 p.m. will be the traditional Christmas Eve service.
- The church annual meeting will be held on January 28, 2024.
