A Post from the Pastor

Good morning church! And when I say this, I mean all you here at Emanuel Lutheran and beyond who make up the church—the faithful followers of Jesus Christ. I have experienced the support, love and prayer of God's extended church and I want to say thank you. As many of you may know I got a phone call that no one ever wants to hear. My baby brother, Tommy, was bleeding internally and not expected to live. After a flurry of phone calls I found myself up very early getting a

ride to the airport for a 6 am flight. The not knowing was agony! Then I arrive in Texas and because of COVID only one family member could be with my brother per 24-hour time period. I was really angry that I my sister and I had come all this way, and were scared and just wanting to be with our brother and we couldn't.

My sister's sister-in-law and her wife offered up their spare bedroom to my sister Miranda and myself, my cousin picked us up from the airport—my sister's mother-in-law even came to Houston from her home two hours away to be a stand in mother for the weekend. Everywhere I turned I literally could feel myself and my family being lovingly held in prayer. I let my sister see my brother first because I felt she needed to see how bad it was so she could have realistic expectations. We arrive at the hospital together, I was thinking I could hole up in a coffee shop somewhere in the hospital and be nearby if Tommy's condition suddenly got worse. Well I was only allowed into the building to the temperature check station and wasn't allowed any farther into the hospital as my brother could only have one visitor. I wasn't even allowed into the building. My sister turned around to say bye and I was already up the sidewalk not knowing what to do, alone and scared in a big city with my brother very very sick.

I found my way to a Starbucks but there was no room in the inn there either—they had only four tables all occupied. So I went next door to Chipotle and got in line to buy a bottle of water so I could at least make use of their air conditioning until I could figure out what to do next. Then my sister calls me up sobbing that it was so awful seeing him so pale and hooked up to so many machines. I just wanted to be able to give my sister a hug, in big sisterly fashion, and reassure her it was all going to be ok. I sat down with my water and tried to figure out how to get an Uber so I could get back to where we were staying. I asked a nurse from the hospital sitting near me if she could help me as I was so upset. I told her, "my brother is dying". Tears immediately sprang to her eyes and she asked if she could pray with me. There in the middle of this strange, big, scary city and experience this complete stranger takes my hands in hers and prayed with me, right in the middle of a busy Chipotle! My Uber driver, Patrick from Cameroon, shares that he thinks people are basically good and asks for my brother's name and says he'll pray for him.

My sister sent me pictures of my brother and all of his monitors which I then sent to Megan Sorenson who helped us interpret what was going on. At the start the doctors and medical team were reluctant to share medical information with us and my brother named his roommate Erin to make decisions for him if he wasn't able to make them for himself. Then Sat. it's my turn. By this time, he's starting to make a tiny bit of headway and as the day continues it's becoming more and more apparent that Tommy is going to pull through. Needing a break, I go to stretch my legs and make my way to the chapel and sit in quiet for several minutes gazing up at a crucifix mounted on the wall. I see Jesus near death, with a piece of cloth across his hips reminding me so much of my brother six floors up lying pale in a bed draped in a towel to protect his dignity. The message of Jesus, who took on all of the suffering and brokenness in the world, and took it into his physical body never hit me more profoundly than that afternoon sitting in a small chapel.

After I came back up to Tommy's room I felt this very surprising yet deep calm, and was at peace. I felt as ready as I could be for my brother to die or to live. After several conversations I felt that I could be assured that my brother was going to live, that he was in the best possible hands, and it was ok for me to go home.

Within the last two days, my brother was taken off the ventilator, taken off sedation, taken off dialysis had his medications decreased, and I even got to talk to him! It's a miracle that he's alive! Again I want to thank all of you for your continued support and prayers. This whole event was so huge and overwhelming, at times really scary and at other times indescribably joyful! I am so blessed to serve this community and want to let you know how much I care and love all of you. Thank you, thank you and most of all thank you God!

Emanuel's Stewardship Plans for 2022

This year, we are changing our format. We will have a roundtable discussion on a specific question in the community room after our services on Sunday, November 7th and Sunday, November 14th. We will meet in groups of six to eight people and each table will have a facilitator to help with the discussion as well as take notes of the points discussed. These sessions will last approximately 30 minutes.

The discussion on November 7th will be addressing the question, "How can Emanuel effectively meet your needs

and the needs of our community in 2022?" November 14th, we will be discussing, "Aside from not being comfortable with COVID, why aren't people back 100% at Emanuel?"

We want everyone's comments to be addressed. If you are listening to broadcasts of the services on



those two Sundays, you will have an opportunity to state your comments online each of those Sundays. For those unable to attend in person, or via the broadcasts, Pastor Cara will send out a mailing to all members early in November asking for feedback.

On Sunday, November 21st, during the service we will get a brief summary of all the comments received on November 7th and 14th and from those who participated online and by mail.

Included in our mailing on October 22 was a pledge card for 2022. Pledges are relied upon to help determine what is reasonable for a 2022 budget. Each of us will have the opportunity to bring our pledge card forward to the altar during the service on Sunday, November

21st. Our coffee hour on the 21st will include a light brunch.

Emanuel certainly is appreciative for everyone's support during 2021. We look forward in 2022 to supporting more of JESUS VISION-OUR MISSION-FOCUSING ON YOU.


Next meeting is November 15 with Al Martens doing devotions.

Giving Back to Their Community

Amber and Donald had always felt called to provide foster care. But any time they would consider taking the leap and starting the process, the thought of "what if?" would leave them feeling stuck. Now, Amber can't imagine life without the children her family has cared for over the years.

Amber and Donald became licensed to provide foster care and adopt children almost seven years ago. Since then, they have provided foster care for 17 lowa children and adopted six. Amber says one of her favorite parts of the experience is seeing her adult children bond with each child who enters their home.

"It's crazy to see our 25-year-old so bonded with our two-year-old. We don't label the kids as 'adoptive' or 'biological', they're just all our kids," Amber says. "That bond is just as huge whether it's biological or not."

As lowa continues to see a need for more foster and adoptive families, Amber says becoming licensed is one way lowans can give back to their community.


"God gives us all gifts, and parenting and helping in the community seemed to be what He put in our hearts," Amber says. "If you haven't found a place to help in your community, consider foster care and adoption," she says. "It could be exactly what your purpose is."
