Dear friends in Christ,

Here at Emanuel Lutheran Church we are working to widen our welcome to all people. People who live with mental illness and their families often feel excluded from the life of the church. So on May 20, we will observe "Mental Health Sunday" here at Emanuel Lutheran Church.

Our worship service will include prayers and other resources to increase our awareness of issues related to mental health. We will host Jennifer Unruh, from MOSAIC of Western Iowa, who will talk briefly at our worship service about MOSAIC's work in the area of mental health in southwestern lowa. Our Joyful Noise offering that day will be given to MOSAIC of Western Iowa to support that work. But that's not all!

Jennifer and some members of her community will be with us for some discussion during our fellowship time. Then she will meet with members of our congregation who have an interest in a larger mental health ministry here at Emanuel Lutheran Church. If you would like to attend that meeting, please know that you are welcome! The meeting will happen in Pastor Hennigs' office unless the group becomes larger. Then we will find another space. That meeting will happen from 11 a.m. to 12 p.m. on May 20.

We hope that out of this meeting may come a support group for those who live with mental illness in their lives and in their families. Mental illness impacts one in four people in the United States, and that is true in the church as well. We want Emanuel to be a place of safety and welcome for all who are impacted by mental illness and long for the Spirit's healing and help. But there's more!

Staff and community members from MOSAIC of Western Iowa will host a Mental Health Awareness event that afternoon here at Emanuel. The event is called "Kicking the Stigma of Mental Health" and set to start at 12:15 p.m. We will play kickball in the upper parking lot, and people from all of Council Bluffs will be invited. If you are a confirmation student, this event will ** Stigma* be part of our class that day! We hope that people will come to a deeper appreciation of The Mental both the gifts and the struggles that mental illness presents to the church.

Would you please consider wearing your Emanuel "God's Work, Our Hands" shirts that day? If you don't have one of those shirts, I think we're about to place an order for more. So watch for that opportunity. If you have questions and/or want to be part of this event, please contact Pastor Hennigs (emanpas1@hotmail.com). It's a joy to be part of such a positive event!





The meeting was called to order at 6:59 p.m. by President Rosie Spangenberg

Devotions: Mike Winter

Council Agenda:

- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Elaine Sasso to approve the secretary minutes after correcting the spelling of Valerie to Valarie and correcting that the Worship and Music Report should be corrected to show that "if" rather than that new banners were purchased from the same company that made the paraments, it would cost \$1,500 a pair. Approved.
- Motion by John Spilde, seconded by Elaine Sasso to approve the Financial Secretary report. Approved.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Judi Malloy to approve the Treasurer's Report. Approved.
- Motion by Judi Malloy, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the Capital Fund Report. Approved.
- Motion by Peggy Jarrell, seconded by Joel Hauschild to approve the Memorial Fund Report. Approved.
- Pastor Hennigs gave a 17 point report. The Emanuel Fresh Start Team received a recommendation from the Church of the Damascus Road for a candidate, but the team felt the candidate should not be recommended. The Faith Team met on March 26 and urges the council to approve a parking lot sign that points to additional parking in the upper parking lot. The expense would be approximately \$300. They also recommended that we rename some of the spaces in the building and place signs to point to those spaces. In particular, visitors sometimes don't see where we worship. It is recommended that we designate our sanctuary as the "WORHSIP CENTER". The Fellowship Hall should be renamed "Community Room". The Team is also exploring the creation of prayer paths and a

prayer labyrinth as part of our property here at Emanuel. We closed on the daycare construction mortgage on April 4. We have received the second of two payments of \$6,000 from the ELCA Congregational Renewal Office for our 2018 grant. The balance in the Special Needs Fund on February 28 was \$1,358.21. Three hundred dollars (\$300) was requested for a member family in need early in March, leaving the current balance at \$1,058.21. Our next new member reception will be Sunday, April 29, 2018. The Western Iowa Synod Assembly will be held from June 8-June 10, 2018 at the Convention Center in Sioux City. We need to be represented by two voting members and the cost will be paid by the congregation. Pastor is working to recruit members for a Spiritual Gifts Team to focus exclusively on the identification and deployment of spiritual gifts, time and talents here at Emanuel and will free up the Stewardship and Finance Committee to focus exclusively on money matters. Pastor attended the Comprehensive Bereavement Skills Training Course through the Center for Loss and Life Transition in Fort Collins, Colorado from April 8 - April 12, 2018. Michaela attended the Administrative Assistant Gathering in Storm Lake, Iowa on April 12, 2018. An initial meeting of members interested in mental health ministry here at Emanuel met on April 15. We will have a mental health ministry Sunday here at Emanuel on May 20, 2018.

- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by John Spilde to spend \$300 for the signs recommended by the Faith Team. Approved.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Joel Hauschild to allow the Pastor to take a vacation from July 2 through July 15, 2018. Approved.
- Stephen Lewis gave a report for the Youth and Children's Ministries Committee. Fourteen (14) attended the Maunday Thursday Lock In and forty participated in the Easter Egg Hunt.
- Bob Vergamini reported for the Property Committee that May 26, 2018 and September 29, 2018 are workdays. They intend to contour the ground near the bridge as it cannot be mowed. A plumber needs to install a new sprayer head to the sink that's near the dishwasher,
- Connie Solon reported on Wider Ministries and indicated that Earth Day would take place on Sunday, April 22, 2018.

- The church council will be responsible for serving coffee on May 6, 2018 as organized by John Spilde.
- Rosie Spangenberg gave the Worship and Music report. The Jonathan Rundman Concert will be September 22 and September 23, 2018 and hotel reservations will be made for the Rundman family which includes his wife and two children. A "concert fund" will be started to finance future events. Thirty additional hymnals were purchased for a cost of \$719 using Memorial Funds. The cost is \$24 apiece. Mike Hipnar will pursue purchasing additional projectors with an estimate of \$1,200 for two projectors.
- The Boy Scouts will need a new liaison to replace Linda Vergamini. Erin Miller will fill that need.
- Bob Vergamini has resigned as a member of the church council.
- Motion by Elaine Sasso, seconded by John Spilde to appoint Amy Garreans to serve the un-

- expired term until the Annual Meeting in January 2019. Approved.
- The council gave a thank you to Bob and Linda Vergamini for their service to the Worship and Music Committee, to Emanuel and for Bob's service on the church council.
- Da Band will be playing at Barley's on May 1, 2018 for a youth fundraiser. They will also be playing on May 19 in Bayliss Park after the Celebrate Council Bluffs Parade. August 11, 2018 is the tentative date for the Emanuel Garage Sale. "God's Work. Our Hands." will be September 9, 2018. We will be taking new shirt orders.
- Motion by Judi Malloy, seconded by Connie Solon to adjourn at 8:33 p.m. Approved.
- All reports presented to the council may be viewed by any church member at the church office.

The next meeting with be Monday, May 21, 2018 at 7 p.m.



Updates

We will host the next "speed greeting" events on fifth Sundays of the month. The next fifth Sunday is April 29. We will have a preparation on April 22 during the announcements. Judy has volunteered as one of the demonstrators. We need one more volunteer for that day.

Progress on our current ninety-day goals (January 1-March 31).

- a. (ACCOMPLISHED) <u>Children</u>: A children's bell choir during Lent Cindy will engage children in a "boomwhacker" choir for Holy Humor Sunday on April 8 and has introduced the instruments to the children.
- b. (BUILD ON THIS) Lay Leadership: Church council will seek ways to engage leaders and congregation in materials from the Changing Hearts in the Heartland workshop. Council will use portions of those studies during devotion times in the next several months.
- c. (BUILD ON THIS) Faith: The Stewardship and Finance Committee will engage our spiritual gifts coach and seek to bring that emphasis to the congregation this spring. Thursday morning adult study is reading and studying Neal Boese book on Spiritual gifts in March and April. The church council has approved the establishment of a Spiritual Gifts team to be recruited and to work with the coach. Suggestions for team members?

(ACCOMPLISHED/BUILD ON THIS) <u>Faith</u>: Lenten midweek services included five congregational members who shared faith stories and/or faith experiences to inspire, encourage and model such sharing among members more generally. <u>How could we incorporate this periodically into Sunday morning worship? We will do this quarterly, the first Sunday talk being given on May 20 (tentatively). Pastor Hennigs will recruit.</u>

We will pursue wall signs to indicate the locations of the "Worship Center", "Community Room" (aka Fellowship Hall) and restrooms, especially to assist newcomers and guest.
- f. <u>Digital church sign</u>—SOME BIDS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED FOR POSSIBLE SIGN PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION. REALISTIC BID CAME IN AT ABOUT \$10,000 (THERE WAS ALSO ONE FOR \$100,000). COUNCIL CONTINUES TO PURSUE BIDDING AND INSTALLATION AND IS MOVING FORWARD.


