This pandemic has gone on for so long; we're tired and weary and long for a return to the familiar and comfortable only to hear we've arrived at a new normal and social distancing and masks will be a part of our lives for some time yet. We may feel stuck in a rut—what we thought would be a sprint has turned into a marathon and we wonder how much longer we'll have to go on like this.

This is one of those times where we cling to the promise that Christ is with us—even in the bleariest, impossible seeming chapters in our lives. While we've never been promised a life of ease and bliss; in Christ we claim as our birthright membership in God's family and kingdom. And while we as human beings are limited in our capacities—the God we know, love, and serve is powerful beyond our comprehension and invites us to roll up our sleeves and take part in the work of salvation in this very time and place.

I'd like us all to think about where are we hungry? What is it that we most desire that seems just beyond our fingertips? And is there a creative way we can work together to meet that craving? We have GOOD NEWS! The Nursing Home side of Bethany Lutheran Health Services is resuming visits. We have opened up the vestibule area for visits so they will be inside the doorway area, however this does not mean our building is open. Please read below for the information:

- 1. Two guests allowed at each visit.
- 2. Only one visit per week per resident.
- 3. Take out food is not allowed (even though it's good!)
- 4. You may bring things, but please note that items will be kept in quarantine for 72 hours prior to the resident keeping the item.
- 5. All visits must be scheduled (call 712-328-9500 to schedule your visit)
- 6. Visits are no more than 15 minutes at a time.
- 7. Visiting times run between 8am-11am and 1:00pm-4:00pm no weekend visits at this time.
- 8. Masks must be worn at all times during visits and can not be cloth. Surgical masks are ok.
- 9. The building is not open so please be sure to use the restroom prior to your visit.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Mike Winter. Char Les Kemmish gave devotions.

Secretary's minutes from the December meeting: Motion to approve by Alan Ellis, seconded by Char Les Kemmish. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary report: Motion to approve by Greg Steensland, seconded by Alan Ellis. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Motion to approve by Greg Steensland, seconded by Nick Rickard. Motion carried.

Capital Fund report: Motion to approve by John Spilde, seconded by Mike Loos. Motion carried after some discussion.

Memorial Fund report: Motion to approve by Alan Ellis, seconded by Mike Loos. Motion carried after some discussion.

Committee reports: Finance committee members Rick Stone, Connie Solon, and Matt Solon gave a recap of 2020 finances. This report will be given to the congregation at the Annual meeting January 24th. They thanked the congregation for their continued support during this difficult year. They then presented a proposal to transfer some funds listed on the Consolidated Funds Report as they do every year. Greg Steensland made a motion to approve the proposal. Alan Ellis seconded. Motion carried. The committee members then presented the proposed budget of \$160,984 for 2021. John Spilde made a motion to approve, Nick Rickard seconded. Motion carried. The committee will present the budget to the congregation at the annual meeting January 24th for approval. The Council thanked the finance committee for their hard work during the year and in putting the new budget together.

Pastor Cara gave her monthly written report. She highlighted that the dates for Synod Assembly are April 9-10. This will be held remotely this year at a cost of \$110 per person if registered by

March 15th. Emanuel would like one other person to take part in this along with the pastor. She also highlighted the 2020 Sunday School program of Lessons and Carols held on Dec. 20, thanking all those involved, especially Steve and Michaela Lewis and Cindy Richards.

Old Business:

- Rosie Spangenberg presented a proposal from the Worship and Music committee to purchase a used three-octave set of handbells including cases, 7 4x4 tables with foam and coverings, music binders, mallets, toolkit, polish, and cloths from Epworth Methodist Church. The proposal noted that purchasing this equipment new would cost around \$12,000 to \$13,000. Emanuel has been renting a set of handbells, which now need to be returned. With the restrictions in music brought about by the pandemic, the handbells have been a welcome addition to worship services. Nick Rickard made a motion to approve the purchase for \$4500, using funds from the Elizabeth Miller estate, as discussed at previous Council meetings. Char Les Kemmish seconded it. Motion carried.
- Plans for the annual meeting to be held on January 24th were outlined.

New Business:

- President Mike Winter received a request from the Girl Scouts to allow them to set up a table to sell cookies at church on February 14 and March 21. Greg Steensland made a motion to allow this with a maximum of three sellers. Alan Ellis seconded it. Motion carried.
- President Winter presented a request from the Boy Scouts to hold a drive up pancake breakfast at church on Saturday, March 13, from 9-11 a.m. John Spilde made a motion to approve this request, which includes using the church kitchen. Char Les Kemish seconded it. Motion carried.
- Next meeting is January 24 immediately after the annual meeting to elect new officers. The February meeting is set for February 15, with Mike Winter doing devotions.
- A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Mke Loos, seconded by Nick Rickard. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned by President Mike Winter at 8:09 p.m.


