Dear partners in mission,

The meeting was called to order at 6:51 p.m. by President Rosie Spangenberg

<u>Devotions</u>: Rosie Spangenberg - What's A Piffany?

Council Agenda:

- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Mike Winter to approve the secretary minutes for November 20, 2017. Approved.
- Motion by Judi Malloy, seconded by Valarie Weelborg to approve the Financial Secretary (Consolidated Fund) report. Approved.
- Motion by Judi Malloy, seconded by Patty Maxwell to approve the Treasurer's Report. Approved.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Connie Solon to approve the Capital Fund Report. Approved.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Judi Malloy to approve the Memorial Fund Report. Approved.
- Pastor Hennigs presented a 10 point report. He continues to offer communion service on the fourth Monday of each month at Midlands Living Center. He encouraged us to attend the annual meeting of Bethany to be held on Sunday, January 14, 2018 at 1:30 p.m. The Emanuel Fresh Start Team met on November 28 and it was reported that Dwight Rogers is now working for Super Saver and things are working out well. The Emanuel Renewal (Faith) Team met on November 6 and November 27. We have applied for a loan with ELCA Mission Investment Fund. At this time, they will only approve a one year grant from the ELCA Congregational Renewal Office of \$12,000 for calendar year 2018. We

need to execute a partnership covenant document in order to receive that support. We must reapply each year. We had hoped to obtain \$60,000 over three years, but that has changed. A request was made in early November for \$300 from a member family from the Special Needs Fund. That fund now has a balance of \$858.21. Amy and Mason Garreans were baptized on November 19 and became members. Mike Garreans made his affirmation of faith and they were all recognized at worship on December 10. Pastor and his wife Brenda have now purchased a home in Omaha near 135th & Harrison. The Synod Leadership Event will occur on Saturday, February 10, 2018 in Carroll, Iowa. Everyone was encouraged to attend. They leave Emanuel at 7 a.m. and return by 5:30 p.m. If you are interested, you must register before January 25 to get a \$10 discount.

- Motion by Judi Malloy, seconded by Patty Maxwell to approve the Partnership Support Covenant with ELCA. Approved.
- Motion by Peggy Jarrell, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the housing allowance resolution for calendar year 2018 as follows: "It is resolved that the total compensation paid to Reverend Lowell R. Hennigs for calendar year 2018 shall be \$51,500 of which \$18,000 is hereby designated as a housing allowance pursuant to Section 107 of the Internal Revenue Code and it is further resolved that the designation of \$18,000 of Reverend Lowell R. Hennigs' annual compensation as a housing allowance also shall apply to all future years that Reverend Lowell R. Hennigs is employed by Emanuel Lutheran Church, Council Bluffs, Iowa, unless otherwise provided." Approved December 18, 2017.
- Connie Solon gave the Stewardship/Finance Committee report and reported that they have not received as many pledges as hoped for. There have been 59 pledges so far which is 70% ahead of last year's total, but last year had total pledges of 72.
- Motion by Connie Solon, seconded by Bob Vergamini to purchase a computer for the work room for a cost similar to what was paid for the last computer of \$292.70. Approved.

- Report was received and prepared by Stephen Lewis on the Children's/Youth Ministry Committee. Among other things, ten households participated in the Angel Tree Party with six households attending the party. Santa Claus also attended. Fundraisers for the 2018 Youth Gathering have raised \$6,487.67. Fundraisers for the Youth Fund have raised \$3,113.17.
- Bob Vergamini gave the Property Committee report. \$419.21 was spent to repair the dishwasher. The office computer has been freezing up and a new one can be purchased for less than \$300. Alan Ellis recommended the computer which he is using in his business which was purchased for a cost of \$292.70. The purchase of the new computer was approved. Bob Vergamini talked about providing an area on one of the walls in the Fellowship Hall to display artwork that has been given to the church or created by members of the church. That issue was tabled until Bob could visit with other interested parties. The Property Committee recommended the lease of a new copying machine. Based upon that recommendation, a motion was made by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Suzanne Winter, to lease a Kyocera 3252CI copying machine with a projected cost of \$232 per month which includes service, two sided and color copying, scanner and stapling. That would be \$100 per month more than the cost of the current lease. Approved.
- Suzanne Winter gave the Wider Ministries report. There were 20 Thanksgiving baskets serving 182 people.

Open your heart and home to a child



Staff from Lutheran Services in Iowa, who are administrators for the program in Western Iowa, invite you to attend an important Informational Session hosted by St. Paul Lutheran in Treynor at 9:15 on Sunday morning, January 7 to learn more. The annual meeting will be held after the 9:30 a.m. service on January 28, 2018.
- Peggy Jarrell, Connie Solon and Bob Vergamini are working on the facility's usage request form.
- A congregational information meeting will be held during coffee hour after the January 21, 2018 service.
- Judi Malloy will provide devotions at the next meeting.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Suzanne Winter to adjourn at 8:41 p.m. Approved.
- All reports presented to the council may be viewed by any church member at the church office.

Over the next few months they will gradually move their belongings to the house in Omaha. Pastor Lowell will begin commuting to Emanuel (and Brenda's Omaha commute will be much shorter!).
