A Post from the Pastor

I grew up in the Black Hills of South Dakota, named for the spruce trees that grow there. They have dark stripes on their bark making the hills look black from a distance. Every year fires burn through the area making the news—the destruction monitored carefully so that too much of the forest doesn't burn. COVID has been likened to a forest fire finding human wood to burn. As we continue on and we look to our church it can seem like looking out over the smoldering remains of a forest fire. Charred and black, with huge gaping holes that used to be filled with trees. But every year you could rely on little shoots of green appearing and growing until the remains of the fire became reclaimed by the forest.

Here at Emanuel and in our community COVID found lots of human wood to burn and has impacted the ecosystem of our church. Some folks have left, some have died, and many are absent for unknown reasons. It's easy to despair. Where I find hope, those green shoots springing forth, is in young children giggling and running through the fellowship hall, the happy din of voices laughing and talking over coffee hour, people coming forward for communion, and singing the liturgy. I truly believe God continually presents us with opportunities to serve God and neighbor and over time our forest will be green and lush again.

Towards our regrowth as a community yours truly has been working at connecting with the larger community. I'm happy to announce I've been elected to the board of Habitat for Humanity, and am looking forward to working with others to provide affordable housing in our community. I've also been able to attend the North Broadway Neighborhood Association and begin to make connections there. The NBNA recognizes that a neighborhood church is a vital sign of a healthy neighborhood and support our presence and ministry here. I also continue to reach out to St. Paul's Episcopal to find where our two churches can partner in outreach ministry as well how we can collaborate with children's ministry. This is just a start.

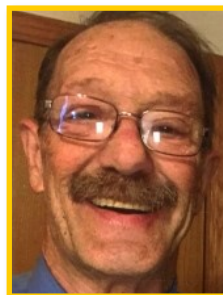
I've been thinking quite a bit how Emanuel is really good about stepping up to help out when there's a need—bringing food for funerals, picking up donations and organizing for the annual rummage sale, helping in preparations for Mardi Gras, and Tea for Two, giving generously to groups who visit us on Noisy Offering Sundays. So maybe a way for us to think of outreach is to all listen together and when anyone hears of a need they think Emanuel could help with to share the news. We're already doing this in small ways, like when we hold boxes for someone moving, or help one another with rides to doctor's appointments. Maybe God will send up opportunities to show up and help in big ways as well.

My challenge for all of us is this: send me an email or tell me as you leave services or grab me over coffee hour and share what you'd like to see Emanuel do in the next year. Where do you see little sprouts of green popping up that we can encourage and support? Together we can be co-creators with God in helping make a safe and just world.

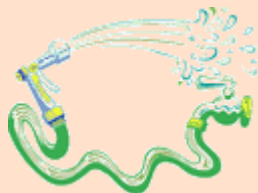

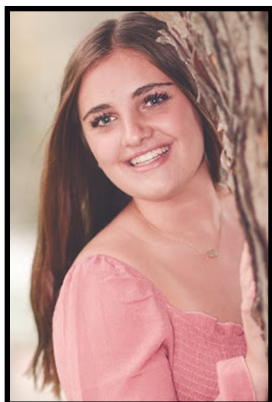
Patio Volunteers Needed

Lauren Hansen

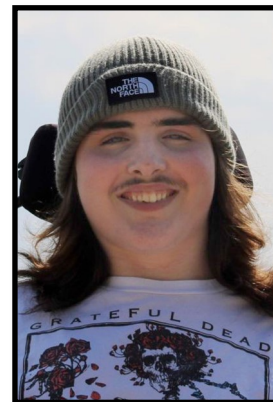
Abraham Lincoln High School

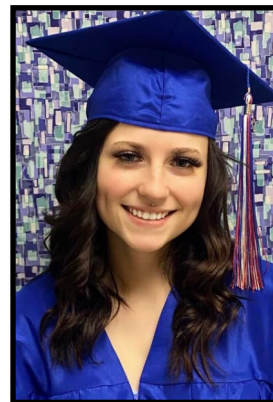
Lewis Central High School

The couple says Andrea and LSI have been a "breath of fresh air," and they feel more empowered and in control of their life.

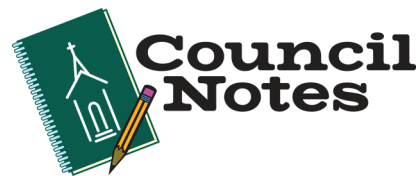

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by President Mike Winter. Alan Ellis gave a prayer.

Secretary's minutes from the April meeting: Motion to approve by Connie Edson, seconded by Alan Ellis. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary report: Motion to approve by Chris Reed, seconded by Alan Ellis. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Motion to approve by Chris Reed, seconded by Nick Rickard. Motion carried.

Capital Fund report: Motion to approve by Alan Ellis, seconded by Chris Reed. Motion carried.

Memorial Fund report: Motion to approve by Char Les Kemmish, seconded by Connie Edson. Motion carried.

Pastor Cara presented her monthly report. May has been Emanuel's month to provide Sunday worship services at Bethany Lutheran each Sunday at 4pm. She met with the Habitat director and Linda Steensland about her serving on the board for Habitat. Linda will nominate Pastor Cara at the May meeting. If elected, she will serve on the Restore committee. Pastor Cara has been in contact with Bob Collins about St. Paul's partnering with Emanuel for VBS this summer. She requested vacation from Monday, June 20 through Saturday, June 25. Pastor Stephany would be available to attend to any emergency pastoral care needs. Motion to approve by Alan Ellis, seconded by Nick Rickard. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Worship and Music Committee - They would like to purchase 4 Timpani from Red Oak High School. Motion to approve by Alan Ellis, seconded by Connie Edson. Motion carried. The fund will come from Music and Worship. Also, 2 churches, New Horizon Presbyterian and Our Savior's Lutheran, have offered to have our Bell Choir join theirs and then play at both churches. Our Bell Choir members showed little interest in these options. No inquiries in the Job postings have come in either.

Property Committee - Char Les Kemmish reported on the wind damage of the Facia. The council reviewed the damage after the meeting. What is the deductible of our policy? Alan Ellis will contact a few companies to get bids. Char Les also says that more members are needed on the Property Committee, anyone interested in please contact Oscar Over or Char Les Kemmish.

Mutual Ministry - Greg has contacted Synod, but no one has returned his call. He will call again. Also working on setting up first committee meeting.

Old Business:

Progress on bathroom remodeling - Alan Ellis reviewed the old bathroom remodeling plans and we took a tour of the old kitchen that will be the new Family and Handicap Bathroom. Alan is working on new bids.

Pastor Cara confirmed with Synod that we should store the Flood Buckets for when they are needed.

Spring Work Day is scheduled for June 4.

Progress on calling inactive members - no great feedback.

New Business:

The council members have decided that a Van is not needed for the church or congregation so the Van Fund of \$3,455 will be moved to the Display Sign Fund. Motion to approve by Chris Reed, seconded by Greg Steensland. Motion carried.

There will be a baptism on June 19.

Alan Ellis will get bids for Electronic Display Sign, the funds are currently at \$6,763. Plus, Alan would like to use Kara Nickels Memorial Fund of \$2,931 for the Display Sign.

Next meeting is June 20 with Char Les Kemmish doing devotions.

Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Alan Ellis, seconded by Chris Reed. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned by President Mike Winter at 7:49pm.

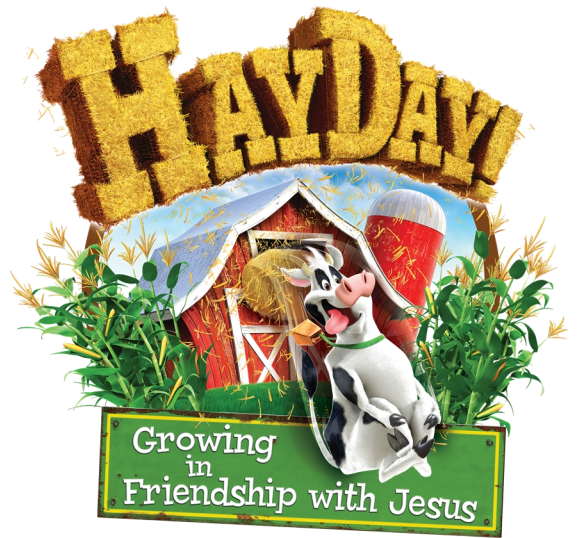
