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The Gift of Two Clouds

Throughout this year I've been making time for regular spiritual retreats. I plan to start spiritual direction training this fall and so I'm curious about retreat locations in my area— what kind of experiences does each community offer? How are they similar, different, and which kinds do I prefer? Most recently I made a pilgrimage to Conception Abbey in Conception MO, near Maryville, MO. It was an absolutely lovely place and the hospitality was warm and sincere even though I barely spoke to anyone. Signs everywhere said welcome guest and helped me figure out where I wanted to go and how to get there.

I spent a better part of a day curled up in the lounge with a pot full of coffee, a quilt over my lap, and *The Cloud of Unknowing* in my hands. Written by anonymously in the later half of the 14th century, the book offers guidance for beginners. I found a very old, and very helpful way of imagining prayer. The Cloud teaches that God is beyond our ability to know or understand completely. Between us and God is a cloud of unknowing, a darkness, not of sin or anything bad. The darkness is like when Paul writes we see through a glass darkly. Our humanity prevents us from being able to see or comprehend God. However, we can connect with God through love, and in so doing, experience God through the power of God's love.

"Faith doesn't mean having all the answers but trusting God even with all of our questions and unknowing." We come to and experience this love through prayer. This is where the second cloud comes in, the cloud of forgetting. This becomes a type of place holder for all the things we think about and random thoughts that float across our minds. These things aren't bad, but when we place the below the cloud of forgetting we create an internal space that makes room to connect with God's love through prayer. When approaching God through prayer and love, the writer teaches to choose a word, the shorter the better, to gently draw our attention back to when our mind wanders. Sound familiar? What I found really interesting is that *The Cloud of Unknowing* was little known until the early 20th century. Spiritual writer Evelyn Underhill wrote an adaptation of the work and brought it into the public awareness. Since then this work became the primary basis for Centering Prayer developed by Trappist monks William Meninger, Basil Pennington and Thomas Keating.

I've been attracted to meditation and centering prayer for years, but in the back of my mind I wondered how Christian was it? It was reassuring to me that this form of prayer is well grounded in both Christian tradition and Scripture. David writes in the Psalms: Be still and know that I am God. In 1 Kings the prophet Elijah doesn't find God in the wind or earthquake or fire but in the sound of sheer silence. Paul not only wrote about dark mirrors but also that we can trust while we may not be able to fully understand God, God's love is complete. Martin Luther even chimed in. If Brother Martin wrote about it, we know it's kosher for Lutherans (I'm hoping you caught the humor of that remark). Luther often spoke of God being hidden even when God is made known fully and most clearly through Christ. We are not saved because we have perfect faith or absolute certainty, but because of the gift of grace from God. Faith doesn't mean having all the answers but trusting God even with all of our questions and unknowing.

The great thing about the prayer practice presented in *The Cloud of Unknowing* is that it's not something you have to do for years to master and finally break through to God's love. A absolute beginner can practice this form of prayer right away and experience God. Find a quiet place, sit comfortably, and choose a simple word like love, peace, or grace. When thoughts arise notice them and gently return to your prayer word and awareness of God's loving presence. There's no right experience or feeling required but simply offering yourself to God. I've been using a free app through Contemplative Outreach that walks you through how to do Centering Prayer and lets you customize your time with different types of prayers, Scriptures and sounds. I really like it— it's simple and easy to use. We're a society not much accustomed to silence. We get uncomfortable with silence, or at least I do, wanting to fill it up with chatter and noise. Which is probably why this raving extrovert is so drawn to this solitary and silent practice. It helps bring balance I'd like to invite you just starting with five minutes each day simply resting in God's presence. Simply be. Trust that even when God seems to hide behind a cloud of unknowing, Christ is present, holding you in love.

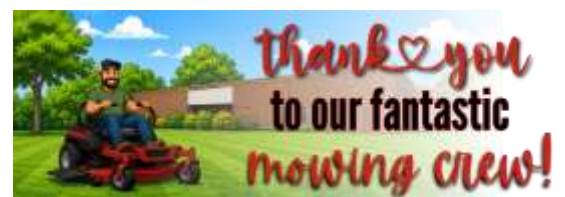

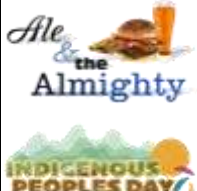
