Walking Together into Advent and Beyond By Pastor Cara Knutson

Good afternoon! It's a cold and wet day—perfect to be indoors and writing to you. As I look ahead into November I wanted to take this opportunity to share about some new things we'll be trying out here at Emanuel.

We're a small but big hearted and generous church. I've been thinking of ways we could work together with the other Lutheran churches in Council Bluffs, Our Savior's and St.

John, to make a bigger impact in our little corner of the world. What can we do better together than we can do alone? Confirmation comes to mind. Our next class will begin Fall of 2027 with only 3 potential students. To-

gether with Our Savior's and St. John we can have a larger community for our students and a bigger pool of resources, ideas, leadership and etc. to draw from.

To start us off towards working and collaborating together I'm excited to announce that this Advent Emanuel, Our Savior and St. John will be joining together for a community midweek service. Services will take place each Wednesday in Advent beginning with a meal at 6 pm followed by worship. Wed. Dec. 3 will be at St. John and I'll be preaching, Wed. Dec. 10 will be at Our Savior's and Wed. Dec. 17 will be here at Emanuel. If you would like to be in charge of planning the meal on the 17th let me or the office know.

Looking ahead to Christmas, after looking at our attendance our staff has decided and council has agreed to have two services this Christmas Eve. The first will be a family service at 4:30 pm. A second traditional candle lit service of lessons and carols will be at 7 pm. In between we'll be having a holiday potluck that everyone is welcome to attend. Come to the first service and stay for dinner. Grab dinner before the second service. Come for all three! This also gives those in worship leadership a chance to have a holiday meal together.

We'll also be trying out some new things with Dinner Church. People have really responded to having a project at each service that helps our community. For Oct. we made thanksgiving bags that contain everything for a thanksgiving meal for a smaller group of people. In Nov. we'll be making birthday party in a pan kits. Both the Thanksgiving bags and the Birthday kits will be donated to the Story Street Pantry. If you have an idea for a project that can help out our local community let me know. Let's try things out, see how they work and adjust, adapt and keep moving forward.

On November 9, and the 16th, we are confident that we will provide a fun way to educate us all on stewardship. November 23, will be PLEDGE Sunday during our service, and a breakfast following the service. Emanuel looks forward to a strong 2026 by being good stewards of God's creation.

Committee Highlights:




Deeply committed to her faith and community, Jane served with Habitat for Humanity, P.E.O., Service


