Good morning! I love to start every morning with some quiet and a cup of good coffee. In the morning stillness the my internal jangles and tangles get smoothed out somewhat and the caffeine helps get me going. When I have to jump right into activity, which happens

We all have ways of being, thinking, acting, etc that get in the way of being the person we'd like to be and the person God calls us to be. Like I said in a recent sermon sometimes I fall into the trap of feeling the point of life is to continually work towards perfection. Perfection isn't attainable; I get discouraged; and then I get stuck. Your sticky situations that get you stuck aren't going to be the same as mine but I'm sure you can relate. The question is how do we get unstuck?

For me, whether it's a sewing project or a lesson plan, when I feel stuck I often find another person's perspective helpful. I had a mentor tell me once we're always surrounded by God's people. So when we're stuck, ask for help.
