A Post from the Pastor BY PASTOR CARA KNUTSON

Good morning Church!



First off, I want to say a big thank you to everyone for the well wishes, cards, and gifts you gave to me for Pastor Appreciation Day. It was very special to me and so thoughtful. I was completely surprised which made it all the better. I am delighted to be a part of this community serving as your pastor.

With confirmation right around the corner I thought I'd share a little of the background of confirmation. In the early days of the church baptism, confirmation and first communion all took place during the great Easter Vigil. Those taking part would walk into a small pool of water and would be baptized. When they came up they were dressed in a white robe, and the bishop laid hands on them and anoint them with oil—confirming their baptism. Then they would receive communion for the very first time.

Over time as Christianity began to grow and spread it became impossible for bishops to be present for every baptism. To solve this quandary, the bishops delegated baptism and first communion to the pastors keeping for themselves laying on of hands and anointing with oil which would be done when the bishop traveled somewhere nearby. Overtime, the local pastors would administer the Rite of Confirmation as well.

Some folks think of Confirmation as a graduation. They've undergone teaching and have finally finished. But if you go back to confirmation's origin story with its link to baptism, confirmation is more of a beginning than an ending. Growing in faith is a process that takes time—an entire lifetime in fact.


Nor is confirmation another punch on the punch card of faith. It's not get ten punches and the llth one is free grace. Confirmation at its heart is meant to be an outward and physical sign of the work God has already begun inside each believer. It's a celebration of God's achievement in us, not our achievement in God.

Also, confirmation is a good reminder for all of us that this is God's work. There will be young people that after confirmation we'll see little of. That doesn't mean that confirmation didn't take or that we as a community did something wrong. I firmly believe that God plants seeds of faith within us, that again take a lifetime to grow. Maybe the fruit doesn't look like what we expect and surprises us. But, as my pastor father frequently liked to quote from Scripture, "As the tree is bent, so shall it grow."

Thank you for all of you, and most of all thank you God for all you do in our lives and in our world.



ouncil Council Minutes for October 16, 2023

Members Absent: Mike Loos and Brittney Smith

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Greg Steensland

Devotions: Char Les Kemmish

Council Agenda:

- Motion by Mike Hipnar, seconded by Richard Reed to approve the council minutes for September 18, 2023. Approved.
- Motion by Char Les Kemmish, seconded by Connie Edson to approve the Treasurer's report with the correction increasing the number of hours worked by Michaela Lewis. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Hipnar, seconded by Connie Edson to approve the Capitol and Building Fund report. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Winter, seconded by Mike Hipnar to approve the Memorial Fund report. Approved.
- Richard Reed reported that he contacted the family Kara Nickels and Gene Jeppesen to approve their funds totaling \$8,490.50 to be used toward the remodeling of the bathrooms.
- Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Char Les Kemmish to approve the Consolidated Fund report. Approved.
- We received a report from Michaela Lewis regarding the Children and Youth Committee. Included in that report is that four students will be confirmed in the fall of 2025. On Sunday, October 22, students who have completed confirmation will meet and they will design their stoles to wear at confirmation. They will be confirmed Sunday, November 5 during worship service and there will be cake and coffee hour that day instead of donuts. Those students being confirmed are Alex Van Sickle, Gabe Van Sickle, Mason Lewis and Grace Nixt. Trick-or-Treating will be on Saturday, October 28 from 12:30 p.m. to 2 p.m.

- Mike Hipnar reported from the Worship and Music Committee that the bell choir is up and running and will be performing at the services on October 29 and December 10.
- Char Les Kemmish reported that the Property Committee has approved using Great Outdoors for snow removal and ice melt. She also reported that Roto Rooter was paid \$588.50 for services they provided at a cost of \$550 per hour.
- Connie Edson reported that Joyful Noise in November will be for Thanksgiving baskets.
- Motion by Mike Winter, seconded by Mike Hipnar to approve the pastor taking vacation days October 22, Wednesday November 1 and Thursday November 2. Approved.
- Pastor reported that the plumbing problems experienced in the parsonage have not yet been repaired or completed.
- Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Mike Hipnar to approve Ron Rief, Jr. and Jenna Morrison to become members of Emanuel. Approved.
- Motion by Mike Winter, seconded by Char Les Kemmish to deny the request of Mark Smith to bow hunt for deer on church property.
- Motion by Mike Winter, seconded by Char Les Kemmish to have the annual meeting on January 28, 2024. Approved.
- It was agreed by council that the protocol for use of the church facilities will start with filing an application with Michaela Lewis who will then check the calendar to see if those days are available and then forward it to the church council for approval.
- Motion by Mike Hipnar, seconded by Richard Reed to make no charge for members to use the church facilities, but that donations would be accepted. Member usage would include funerals, weddings, receptions, anniversaries, birthdays, showers and open houses such as graduations. These requests also must be approved by the church council and includes the requirement that the facility must be returned to the condition it was in prior to its use.

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- Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Char Les Kemmish to approve the request by Maria Lopez, a non-member, to use the church facility on the afternoon of May 18, 2024 for a graduation subject to the payment of a fee of \$150 plus a \$200 deposit and subject to Maria Lopez finding a church member to sponsor and chaperone this activity.
- Motion by Mike Winter, seconded by Char Les Kemmish to deny the request to use the church facility for holding the republican caucus. We previously denied democrats the use of the church for central committee meetings and the council wanted to be consistent.
- Motion by Char Les Kemmish, seconded by Mike Hipnar to pay Alan Enterprises \$2,943.45 to

come from the Noran Davis Estate for the installation of stair treads and landings. Approved.

- It was noted that Mike Winter, Char Les Kemmish and Mike Loos have served on the council for four years and are no longer eligible to continue on the council after the annual meeting.
- Mike Hipnar is scheduled to do devotions at the next meeting.
- Motion by Richard Reed, seconded by Char Les Kemmish to adjourn at 8:47 p.m. Approved.

National Adoption Month

November is National Adoption Month, a time to honor families who have opened their hearts and homes to children and teens. This month at LSI, we celebrate the families we support through Foster Care and Adoption and raise awareness for the hundreds of Iowa children needing a safe, healthy home.

Iowa foster families, like the Smiths*, raise the bar by opening their loving households to children and teens in need of a place to call home.

At LSI, we understand the importance of keeping youth in their communities to help maintain connec-

tions and stability during times of transition. So, when our staff received a referral for a teenage girl needing foster care placement, they looked inward toward the community.

At the time, homes in the area were either full or not open to accepting teenage placements. Coincidentally, the Smiths were present at a meeting the same night the referral came in. When they heard about Rebecca's* situation, they immediately knew who the child was and wanted to help in any way they could.

The Smiths were already over their licensing capacity, having been granted a variance to accept a sibling group. To be able to bring Rebecca into their home, they would need to be given another variance, which was almost unheard of.

"It was by chance, or the grace of God, that the Smiths were able to accept another child, and give

Rebecca stable а placement with a family LUTHERAN SERVICES IN IOWA in her community," said Dawn Luetje, LSI Director of Resource Family Licensing and Support, working in conjunction with Four Oaks Family Connections.

Thanks to the combined support of the Smiths, LSI staff, and the community, Rebecca was placed in the foster home, where she could maintain her daily activities with the teachers, coaches, and friends she was comfortable with. Rebecca continues to thrive in a stable, loving foster home environment and a caring community.

An Update on Emanuel's 2023 Financials SUBMITTED BY RICK STONE

The Finance Committee regularly estimates Emanuel's finances as compared to the numbers we estimated at the beginning of the year to expected income and expected expenses.

budget of \$171,185. This budget was an estimated \$35,000 deficit for the year. Using a nine-month

trend comparing result in income and expenses

for the year 2022 vs 2023, we are estimating

the deficit for 2023 will be closer to \$27,000.

This year, we are estimating about \$18,500

reduce that deficit. Back in January, we did not have these investments and so that original \$35,000 deficit figure did not include any interest on investments.
