Dear friends in Christ,

As Brenda and I come to the end of our time at Emanuel, I want to share a few items of interest. As you may recall, my last Sunday at Emanuel will be July 7th. My last day in the office will be July 11th. We will take some vacation time for the balance of the month.

Beginning on July 12th, you will have the services of Pastor Stephany Sanborn. Pastor Stephany will serve as "standing supply pastor." She will be here on Sundays to lead worship and to preach. She will be available for pastoral emergencies. She may do a few other things here as time and energy permit. I am grateful that she will be available. I know you will welcome her with love and kindness. You will read a letter of introduction from Pastor Stephany in the July edition of this newsletter.

One of the hardest things for many people to understand is the importance of a pastor and family fully and completely leaving a parish. This is to help the congregation move forward into new mission and service. Brenda and I will not be coming back to Emanuel for any events in the foreseeable future. You may notice that we are bringing to a close social media connections with Emanuel folks. I will not be available for weddings, funerals, baptisms, pastoral visits or emergencies or other contacts. I will not reply to text messages or voicemails with Emanuel connections after July 11th.

This may seem extreme to some. But in my experience and in the experience of the Church, this is the best and most helpful policy and practice. It is not because we don't like someone. It's not because we are angry with anyone. It's not because suddenly we don't care about you. It is because this is the best way for the congregation to move forward into the future. I ask for your understanding and your help in this area, so that we don't have to hurt anyone's feelings by not responding.

The Church Council is doing a fine job of facilitating this time of transition. The Call Committee is moving forward in their work. We have a fine bishop-elect who is a friend of Emanuel and will walk with you into the future. All is well in hand. Most of all, the Holy Spirit leads and guides this process and has already worked out how things will transpire. That is true for Emanuel and it is true for us as well.

We are grateful for our time with you in mission and service. We are looking forward to the next chapter of our life and faith together. We will pray for Emanuel and for you all. We hope you will do the same for us.


Spring Work Day



Mental Health Awareness

June is Men's Mental Health Awareness Month. 1 in 5 adult males experience a mental health problem each year. That estimates to about \$193.2 billion in lost earnings per year. The 5 major mental health problems that affect men are:

- Depression- 6 million men suffer from depression each year
- Anxiety- 19.1 million males (adult and child) have an anxiety disorder, whether its panic disorder or any phobia
- Bipolar Disorder- 1.5 million males, 16- 25, are affected by bipolar
- Psychosis and Schizophrenia- 3.5 million people are diagnosed with schizophrenia, 90% of them diagnosed by age 30 are men.

 Eating Disorders- Males account for 10% of those with anorexia or bulimia. They also account for 35% of those with binge eating disorder.

As of 2010, about 40,000 people died by suicide in the US. 79% of them were male. There are many reasons that men go unchecked. The social norm of its not manly or having to always be strong. Its easier to downplay the symptoms than address them. These all add to the reluctancy to talk to anyone about how we feel.

So, what can we do to help? We can start to look for signs. If we notice our loved one has started losing interest in their hobbies or become isolated. Mood changes are a big flag as well. We can look into the family health background as some of these are predisposed through genetics. The main thing we can do is be there and encourage help. Mental health

affects all walks of life: Gay or Straight, Black or White, Male or Female, Civilian or Military. We are all in this together and together we can help each other.

MENTAL WELLNESS TIPS

IN HONOR OF
MEN'S HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH



TAKE A DEEP BREATH

When you inhale, your diaphragm should expand. When you exhale, your diaphragm should fall. This will help your mind and emotions <u>feel more connec</u>ted to your body, helping ground your thoughts.



RELAX THOSE MUSCLES

Choose a muscle group (try your biceps first) and flex as hard as you can for 5-10 seconds then release the tension. Practice the same flex and release method with muscle groups throughout your body. This causes relaxation to be felt on a spectrum – going from one extreme to the other can help you feel more in control of your body and emotions.



WRITE IT OUT

This is an effective way to express yourself and can help you better understand your emotions. Consider this your first step towards sharing your thoughts with others. Speaking up can be difficult but writing a letter or email can be the gateway to having open and meaningful conversations.


Madison Nickels

A year and a half ago, Kevin was homeless. He struggled with substance use. He didn't have a car. Or a driver's license. Or a job.

Then, his world turned upside down and all at once, his priorities shifted. He found out he was a father to a beautiful baby girl, Willow. Kevin immediately began rehab and fought hard to build a healthy lifestyle. After months of hard work and efforts to get clean, Willow was placed in Kevin's care while her mother received treatment for her substance use disorder.

Kevin turned to LSI's Early Childhood Services for support and a community to help him create the best home for his daughter. After starting services last year, Kevin can't imagine life without LSI.

Through regular in-home visits from Lindsay, his LSI

worker, Kevin is helping Willow develop her language and speaking, as well as her motor skills.

Now one and a half, Willow is learning to use pens and markers, and loves writing and coloring. Her favorite book is a present from her dad – a picture book of the ABCs.

Kevin now has sole custody of Willow, and he works closely with her mother to ensure she gets regular visits. His life has changed for the better, and he credits Lindsay and LSI for walking alongside him on his journey.

"LSI teaches you to think about all the little things we often overlook as parents. And we learn to appreciate those little things more because of it," Kevin says. "LSI is teaching me to be the best father I can be."




RISEN HORSE
