Summer Camp for All Ages!

Lets look forward to summer!

We will have information soon in the community room about the programs at Lutheran Lakeside Camp and Carol Joy Holling Camp, but this information is already available on their websites (www.lutheranlakeside.com and www.caroljoyholling.org). Lutheran Lakeside is located in Spirit Lake, Iowa, and Carol Joy Holling is located in Ashland, NE.

Carol Joy Holling offers camp at half price for first time campers for certain weeks during the summer. The first week (June 2-7) school is still in session in Council Bluffs and the week after (June 9-14) is when we will have Day Camp here at Emanuel. The third week they have the discount is July 7-12. These spaces are limited, so early registration is encouraged.

Both camps offer weeks for 1st – 12th grade, as well as family and grandparent camp. Lots of options to chose from. Emanuel does help with 25% of the cost of camp, as well as an additional amount for first time campers from Emanuel.

Mental Health Awareness

March is Self-Injury Awareness Month. Self-injury or self-harm is a response to emotional distress. Intentional, non-suicidal injuries are a way for a person to mirror psychological pain with physical pain. In some cases, the physical injury has a temporary calming effect. It is used to "feel Something" in response to emotional numbness.

How common is Self-Injury? 15% of teenagers will experience some form of self-injury. This drops to 4% among adults.

Common forms of Self-Injury:

- Skin Cutting- Most common
- Head banging or hitting
- Flesh Burning

Many times these go unnoticed as they are easily hidden.



Signs of Self-Injury

- Arms or legs that show signs of constant injury.
 Ex: bruises, cuts or burns
- Overdressing in warm weather. Ex: Coats or long sleeves in the summer
- Repeated excuses for how they got injured
- Avoidance or isolation, withdrawal from activities they previously enjoyed

Around 90% of self-injury cases begin in adolescence. While they may get a temporary feeling of relief, it carries a lot of shame and stigma. Labeling them "attention seekers" only adds to this.

Ways to help if you notice any of the signs of self-injury

- Stay supportive
- Listen
- Do not judge or act disgusted
- Help them seek counseling if needed.
- Educate yourself

"Scars tell the story of where you have been. They do not dictate where

you are going"

Finding a Support System

Aubreigh knew something needed to change.

She was struggling with substance use and alcohol. She couldn't find a way to take care of her mental health. She was unable to provide a safe home for her son, who needed to move in with his dad. When she finally took a step in the right direction and found a home, all her belongings were stolen.

Through LSI's Family Safety, Risk, and Permanency Services, Aubreigh connected with her worker, Kelsy. Together, the duo is working on budgeting Aubreigh's money, finding a good job, and building a safe home environment for her son.

LSI," she says. "Without them, who knows where I'd be."

Aubreigh now meets with Kelsy once a week and feels like she is finally on the right path after plenty of hard work. She is working with her son and his father to build a healthy co-parenting relationship, and she knows Kelsy will always be in her corner, ready to cheer her on.

"Kelsy has been an awesome resource. She helps if we have issues co-parenting, and we do a lot better now as a family," Aubreigh says. "If I have any problems, Kelsy is there."
