"More Than a Fish Tale" Continues through March 19th

"More Than a Fish Tale" is a study of the Old Testament book of Jonah. The book is part parable, part comedy, and part challenge to our tendency toward narrow localism. Pastor Hennigs will offer this study on Thursdays at 9:30 a.m. in the upstairs conference room and will last about ten weeks. Bring your Bible, your friends, your curiosity, and your sense of humor! We will take time off on March 26th and April 2nd. We will begin a new topic of study on April 9th.

First Communion Class offered in March

Pastor Hennigs will offer first communion instruction for young people who have not yet begun to participate in Holy Communion. The classes will be offered during the Intergenerational Sunday School time (9:45 a.m.) on March 8, 15, and 22. The class is covered in three sessions, so participants should plan to attend all three Sundays. The class will be capped off by the celebration of a simulated Seder Meal on Sunday, March 29. That meal is a part of the class and will be held at 5:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Young people will then receive their first communions at our Maundy Thursday worship service on April 2 at 7 p.m.

Any young person second grade and older is invited to attend and participate. If parents of a younger child believe the child is ready to participate, Pastor Hennigs will consider that request. Parents are expected to attend with their children. All members of the congregation are encouraged to attend these classes to review our communion beliefs and practices. Periodic Pastoral Ponderings (from a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear friends in Christ,

<u>Here we are in the middle of our Lenten journey</u>. It is a rich time in the life of our church and in the life of the whole Church. Here are some details of that journey together.

- You can still pick up your copy of our Lenten Devotion book, called Devoted. The daily devotions have been written by members of Emanuel Lutheran Church. The devotions are based on readings from the Daily Lectionary found in the ELW. Paper copies are available at no cost. Electronic copies are available through Amazon.com at http://www.amazon.com/dp/B00SXBLIN6. As of this writing, over two dozen electronic copies are in use. Twelve of those copies are being read somewhere in Great Britain!
- Midweek worship services continue on March 4, 11, 18 and 25. A light supper will be served at 6 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Worship will be offered at 7 p.m. in the Sanctuary. Worship will feature Holden Evening Prayer, and will also be offered at noon those days. The midweek worship messages will focus on The Lord's Prayer. At the end of the Lenten season, those worship messages will form the basis of an online course on the Lord's Prayer offered through the Emanuel Lutheran Church Youtube channel.
- The Sunday messages in Lent focus on Holy Communion. This is in part to assist our young people and their
 parents as they prepare for First Communion. You can read an article in this edition of the "Garden of Readin"
 that gives the details of that class.
- Palm/Passion Sunday is *March 29th* with worship at 8:30 and 11 a.m. (as usual). At 5:30 p.m. that day, we will hold our annual Seder Meal in the Fellowship Hall. This meal is part of our first communion class and helps the young people and parents to understand the roots of the Lord's Supper in the Jewish Passover celebration. Members of the congregation and community are invited to attend this meal. We will take reservations for the meal, and a freewill offering will be received to help offset expenses.
- There will be no midweek worship or confirmation on Wednesday, *April* 1st, to allow for rehearsals and worship walk-throughs.
- Maundy Thursday worship will be offered on *April 2nd* at noon and 7 p.m. in the Sanctuary. The 7 p.m. service will include First Communion and Foot-washing.
- Good Friday worship will be offered on *April 3rd* at noon and 7 p.m. in the Sanctuary. The 7 p.m. service will include the dramatic reading of "The Cry of the Whole Congregation" and pounding our nails into the cross.
- Easter Sunday is April 5th with worship at 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. Easter breakfast and activities will be held from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. that day. Those activities will include an Easter egg hunt for the children at 9 a.m. Van transportation to and from Emanuel will be available. Please contact the church office at your earliest convenience if you think you would like a ride to worship on Easter Sunday.
- The second Sunday of Easter, *April* 12th, will be "Holy Humor Sunday" at both services. Bring your jokes and be ready to share in the Blessed Mirth of the season.

125th ANNIVERSARY COMMITTEE NEWS

The Anniversary Team met on February 5. We read a small piece of Emanuel history composed about 1915 by the secretary of the lowa Conference, Augustana Synod. It was so very interesting—especially the part about a "vanishing" pastor in the early 1900's! We reviewed Connie Solon's work in reading and excerpting church records. She is putting items in the newsletter each month from Emanuel's history. We had an update from Elaine Sasso regarding photo collection, storage and access. She has found a very inexpensive and efficient way to scan and store digitally 1000 photos. Two team members will cover the cost of about \$50 for that process. The team approved going ahead with that project.

We discussed funding and fundraising. The team will raise some initial funds by hosting the March 25th Lenten supper at ELC. We heard from Cindy Richards regarding music and worship possibilities. She will investigate options and costs for commissioning a musical composition in honor of the anniversary. She will investigate the options for a guest organ concert during the year and for having guest choirs (especially Lutheran college choirs) as part of the anniversary year. We heard from Richard Reed concerning the development of an address database to send invitations to former

staff. There are some blank spaces in the list, and he will request help from longtime members in securing more addresses. We will send "Save the Date" cards for our November weekend in early March.

We heard from Linda Steensland regarding mission project options. She visited with Cindy Wells at the synod office and will put those options into writing for us. We discussed options for creating a searchable database of information based on personal names in our records and photos. Ruth Sullivan will invite Abaigh Plummer to our next meeting to share with us how she carried out such a project for the Dodge House. We got an update from Michaela Lewis on windows in the old church building. They have been removed and are being stored at this point. She will check on their status for the future.

Our next meeting will be March 5 at 5:30 p.m. The agenda will include: Hearing from Abaigh Plummer; Lenten dinner plans; Photo storage project update; Remembrance Tea planning; Mission project options and possible decisions; and other items as they come up.

Meet Emanuel Member...



David Appel! David was born in 1917 on a farm near Dannebrog, Nebraska as the second of four children. (David wanted everyone to know that Dannebrog is also the name of the Danish flag). After high

school, David went to California to work in the oil fields. After several months, he became homesick and went back home. Since two of his uncles had been in the infantry in World War I, he joined the army asking to be placed in the infantry on February 27, 1941. Of course the army did not honor his wishes and placed him with the 18th Combat Engineer's Unit. He spent the summer of 1942 assisting in building the Alaskan highway and he participated in the Battle of Attu in May of 1943 which is the only battle during World War II fought on American soil.

David left the army on June 14, 1945 as a tech sergeant. He married his wife Eileen back home in Dannebrog, Nebraska on December 25, 1945. They were married for 59 years and had three children, two boys and a girl.

David entered the University of Nebraska under the GI bill and received a degree in business education in 1949. From there, he worked for the United States Post Office from 1949 to 1967 when he retired at the ripe old age of 50. He then applied to be a teacher at an Omaha business college, but instead they made him the dean of the business college where he served in that capacity for five years. After that, David spent 10 years with the Metropolitan Area Planning Agency (MAPA) and retired for the last time in 1982.

After his retirement, David built a cabin in Black Hawk, Colorado about 25 miles from Golden.

David joined Emanuel Lutheran Church in 1949 when the church was located at 7th & Mill in Council Bluffs, Iowa



and the pastor was Ernie Holmes. David's energy and laughter are well loved here at Emanuel!

"April is the best person I have ever worked with in her field." The hard reality about parenting a child with a history of trauma is that as much as you want to find the right help, sometimes it's impossible to know where to look.

Just ask Jill and her 15-year-old stepdaughter Sierra.

"Sierra has a history that a child shouldn't have to go through," she said. "We tried to seek help for her in several different places through therapists and institutions and various agencies."

When Sierra was discharged from a residential placement, Jill and her husband were nervous. They knew she wasn't ready to come home, but they felt they had exhausted all the options.

Fortunately, Jill had one last idea. She turned to someone she had known personally for years—April, an LSI social worker.

"I can honestly say that April is the best person I have ever worked with in her field," Jill said. LSI and April were different, Jill said.

"We hit a lot of dead ends with agencies and people we called on for help," she said. "It was frustrating. When we got involved with LSI through April, she always got back to us. She always had a suggestion."

When their family faced a serious crisis last summer, Jill knew exactly who to call.

"My husband and I were in Texas for a work trip," Jill said. "Sierra made some bad choices, and we were concerned about her safety and her caregiver's safety. Honestly, I don't know what we would have done if we hadn't had April getting us the help Sierra needed."

With April's support, the family made a plan to get Sierra in a safe place until they returned home. For Jill, April was a lifesaver. For April, it was simply life as usual at LSI.
