# Periodic Pastoral Ponderings

(From a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear friends in Christ:

On January 22, we voted as a congregation to go forward with our Daycare Mission Outreach Project here at Emanuel Lutheran Church. Thank you for that vote of support. Now is the time to put that decision into action. Let me share some scriptural encouragement as we go forward:

"Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen" (Ephesians 3:20-21). So, what's next?

Step One is to invite you to give toward the start-up costs of the Daycare. Those costs will include staff wages and salaries in the two or three months leading up to the opening of the daycare. Those costs will also include some equipment and furnishings costs as we prepare to open the doors of our daycare. <u>Please attendan information meeting after worship on Sunday, March 12, to hear more.</u>

We hope to have in hand \$60,000 in gifts and pledges two months before begin the operations of the daycare for these start-up costs. You will be invited to consider up-front gifts and/or pledges of gifts over the course of the next three years to assist with these start-up costs. These gifts and pledges will help us to hit the ground running. Those gifts and pledges will also help us to leverage possible gifts and grants from other sources.

Some of those dollars from other sources may come from a grant from the ELCA churchwide folks. We plan to apply for such dollars. If that grant is approved, at least some of those dollars would come to us in 2018. Some of those dollars may come from you and me. <u>Please attend an information meeting after worship on Sunday, March 12, to hear more.</u>

Mortgage payments for the construction of the daycare are built into the business plan for the daycare. So we won't be asking for gifts to offset construction costs (of course, we won't turn down such gifts!). It is the start-up costs that we need to put together. On March 12, you will hear from Kim Egner, John Burns and me, about the plans for the daycare, the progress of the project, and the needs for the start-up funds. Once again, please attend an information meeting after worship on Sunday, March 12, to hear more.

I believe this is the next great step into the future for Emanuel Lutheran Church. This is a needed service for our neighborhood and community. This is an investment in families with children in our congregation and our community. And this is an open door to those families with children who may benefit from the faith, hope and love extended here at Emanuel Lutheran Church.

One more time: <u>Please attend an information meeting after worship on Sunday, March 12, to hear more.</u> Thank you for your tremendous support of and faithful work in our mission and ministry here at Emanuel Lutheran Church. It is an honor to serve with you.

#### Emanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church Council Minutes for 02/13/2017

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Rosie Spangenberg

Devotions: Rosie Spangenberg

#### Council Agenda:

- The president asked each of the board members to tell a little bit about themselves so that everyone would become familiar with the other board members. A sign-up sheet was passed around for people to sign up to do devotions and to be communion assistants.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to approve the January minutes. Approved
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Connie Solon to approve the Financial Secretary report. Approved. It was explained by Connie Solon the details of the financial secretary report. Connie is responsible for preparing that report for each meeting. Ken Kemmish audits those accounts and the accounts are also reviewed by the finance committee. There was also a discussion about the van fund and that issue is to be placed on the next council agenda. Connie explained that 5% of the General Fund receipts go to the Benevolence Fund.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Stephen Lewis to approve the Treasurer's Report. Approved. Connie Solon also gave an explanation of the Treasurer's Report and explained that the carryover from 2016 was \$9,506.26. The receipts for January were above normal because some of the receipts received in December did not get deposited until January.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to approve the Capital Fund Report. Approved. It was explained that the Capital Fund report and the Memorial Fund report are prepared by Richard Reed. The council would like Richard Reed to attend a council meeting to give explana-

tion an explanation of the workings of those funds.

- Motion by Peggy Jarrell, seconded by Bob Vergamini, to approve the Memorial Fund Report. Approved.
  - Pastor Hennigs discussed his January report which contained 16 items. He reported that the Fresh Start team met with Dwight Rogers on January 31 and that Dwight has now returned to the community and our church family and is doing very well. Pastor is also in the process of speaking to potential members of Emanuel Renewal Team individually about being part of the team. He has met with four of the six potential team members. We were reminded that Dan Heithoff was elected as a member of the Bethany Lutheran Home Board of Directors and also is currently serving as their board treasurer. Pastor reported that the future use of the property to the south of Emanuel is uncertain. Bethany has expended substantial sums to prepare the property for development and some development will occur in the future. Pastor and John Burns are working to put in place a possible Capital Fund Appeal Team regarding the daycare project. Pastor would like to schedule a new member reception with council approval for Sunday, March 19, 2017. Pastor indicated that because of a recent discussion regarding a "gifts acceptance policy", he provided the council with a sample form. It was agreed that this would be discussed at the next council meeting to adopt a policy regarding the gifts of stock and other assets to Emanuel. Pastor also reported that he has met with Jack Turner, the senior warden of the vestry at St. Paul's Episcopal Church and discussed their members attending the upcoming Mardi Gras and Emanuel's participation in their upcoming pancake dinner on Tuesday, February 28. It was reported that Emanuel disbursed \$250 to assist a member family after discussion with council president Rosie Spangenberg. Connie Solon had reported that the balance of that fund as of February 5, 2017 was \$1,373.21. Pastor reported that all board members should have received an updated membership roster with contact information.
- Motion by Suzanne Winter, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to discuss at the next meeting the board members' participation in the various church com-

mittees. The board secretary is to provide the board members with a summary of the duties of each of those committees. Approved.

- Stephen Lewis gave a report on the Youth & Children's Ministries. He provided a four page report that can be reviewed by any member of Emanuel in the office of the church secretary.
- Bob Vergamini presented the Property Committee Report. The board has previously given approval to allow Ian Walden to continue with his Eagle Scout project to build a fire pit and benches. A second boy scout named Quinton Birkhoffer has recently contacted Oscar Over concerning his Eagle Scout volunteer project that would include restriping the upper parking lot with the church paying for the materials and Quinton furnishing the labor. Motion by Suzanne Winter, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to approve that request and to allow Oscar Over to follow up with the understanding that four handicapped parking spaces are to be provided in the upper parking lot nearest to the building. Approved. The cost of these projects are to be from the maintenance budget. Any member may review the property committee report at the office of the church secretary.
- Motion by Peggy Jarrell, seconded by Bob Vergamini to approve the annual meeting minutes. Approved.
- Rosie Spangenberg reported on the Worship and Music Committee. Communion trays will be purchased by funds provided by the family of Viola Anderson. The Anderson family will look over the samples and will have input concerning the final purchase. That memorial fund contains sufficient amounts to cover this expense. Rosie also reported that our Bayliss Park service will be held on August 6 at 10 a.m. and we will be joined by Our Savior's Members. It was suggested that St. Paul's Episcopal members also be invited. The Fine Arts Festival is tabled at the present time and the Mardi Gras Event will be held on February 26. The details of that report are available at the church secretary's office.
- Motion by Suzanne Winter, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to hold future council meetings on the second Monday of each month rather than the second Tuesday. This will allow council to meet on a night different than the boy scouts meeting. Approved.
- Dwight Rogers made a report on the Emanuel Fresh Start team and indicated that he is doing very well and eventually would like to participate

in helping others in the future.

- Bob Vergamini discussed the annual unit charter agreement between Emanuel Lutheran Church and the Mid America Council, Boy Scouts of America. Emanuel enters into this agreement each year and he provided the council members with a copy of that agreement.
- A discussion was held to invite Dan and Judy Heithoff to attend a council meeting to discuss their involvement with the Bethany Lutheran Home.
- Motion by Bob Vergamini, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to adopt an official policy that any donation of stock to Emanuel shall be sold as soon as practicable after the gift has been received. Approved.
- Motion by Suzanne Winter, seconded by Peggy Jarrell to adjourn at 9:09 p.m. Approved.

# Renewed hope

THAILAND ELCA.org/hunger

When her parents passed away, 7-yearold Mia was sent to live with a distant relative on the border between Thailand and Burma. Her "caretaker" forced Mia to work in an orchard rather than go to school, and her meager "salary" was stolen by her caretaker. When she was 13, Mia was forced to stay in a different home where she was sexually abused.

Conservative estimates suggest nearly a quarter-million women and girls are victims of human trafficking in Southeast Asia every year, often abused and forced to work for little or no pay. But thanks to the work of New Life Center Foundation in Thailand, supported in part by your gifts to ELCA World Hunger, this isn't the end of the story for victims like Mia.

When she first arrived at the New Life Center Foundation, Mia had significant developmental delays stemming



from years of abuse and neglect. The foundation's staff arranged for her to study in their on-site adult education program, but Mia struggled, as basic tasks, like holding a pencil, were unfamiliar to her.

#### Finding Calm

Nine-year-old JD lost track of how many days he was removed from school.

He would throw things in the classroom, or rip up his papers. Almost every day, he was separated from his classmates and taken to the "Intervention Room," an empty classroom where children have the opportunity to calm down and refocus. But nothing worked.

That's when JD's dad, Jerry, turned to LSI. With his team of LSI therapists and caseworkers, JD has found an interesting way to control his anger: his rock collection.

He's always had a love of gathering "cool, uniquelooking" rocks, and AriAnna, his LSI therapist, has incorporated that into their sessions together.

"Rocks can be used as great relaxation tools, and he spent a lot of time pouring over the rocks I had in my office," AriAnna said.

JD started his rock collection with AriAnna and began bringing it to school with him. He carries his favorites in his "positive choice pouch."

"When I hold them in my hand and breathe, it calms me down," says JD.

Jerry says LSI's help has been life-changing for his son. "He's making better choices now. I'm really proud of him," he says.

This year, JD has been removed from class only once, and for only 15 minutes.

"He has a different identity at school now," AriAnna says. "He's creative and insightful. Now, he knows what he sees in himself, and he wants to share that with others."

# Ramblings from the Back Corner

During Lent this year we will be using Marty Haugen's Kyrie eleison. This kyrie was written as part of his *Gift of God* collection but was also used in *Unfailing Light*, a liturgy that we have used before here at Emanuel.

"Kyrie eleison" is Greek for "Lord, have mercy". It originally came from the Eastern church in the first century. It made it's way west and by the time of Pope Gregory I (540-605) the Kyrie, along with the Gloria in excelsis Deo, and the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) were all sung by the congregation during the Latin Mass. Greek words were continued for the Kyrie in the Latin Mass while the Gloria was translated into Latin in the sixth century, four centuries after it appeared. The Sanctus, which had Hebrew origins, was used in Jewish worship long before the Christian era.

The worship service has a particular pattern which, started with the Jewish traditions, were added to by the first Christians and slightly changed as Christianity moved westward into Italy. This pattern of gathering, word, meal, and sending helps the church serve its mission. The whole worship service is based on patterns set down in the bible.

In the front of our hymnal there are ten different settings of the worship service. All the elements are biblically based on the same pattern of Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. The elements may vary according to the season of the church year.

The Gathering includes the Confession and Forgiveness, (which is where the Kyrie comes), a Canticle of Praise, (Gloria in Excelsis Deo), the Thanksgiving for Baptism, the Gathering Song, and the Greeting, all to prepare us to hear the word.

The Word, which is based on the Jewish tradition, includes the Readings and Responses, the Prayers of Intercession, and the Peace. The Readings (Old Testament, Psalm, New Testament and Gospel) with their responses create a natural rhythm for wor-


shipers to listen, reflect and prepare for the teaching (the sermon). The Hymn of the Day, sung prior to or right after the

sermon, is meant to bring together the texts. This is the congregation's way of proclaiming God's word. This section is concludes by reciting the creed and the prayers of the people. Sharing the peace transitions us to the Meal.

The Meal is made up of the Offering and the Thanksgiving at the Table which is based on the Christ's supper. The table setting, the great thanksgiving, the breaking of the bread, and communion are all done according to Christ's command to "do this in remembrance of me". The Sanctus is sung as a response after the Great Thanksgiving. This is followed by the Communion Song (Lamb of God).

The Sending contains a Blessing, a Sending Song and Dismissal. The Sending empowers the congregation to take God's message into the world.

Like so many things in the world, (music, science, nature, etc.) patterns eliminate the chaos. Thanks Be To God!!
