Stewardship, Mission, Faith

Welcome to Stewardship Month. Our theme this year is Stewardship—a Mission of Faith. I thought for this month's newsletter article we could breakdown what each of those words mean: stewardship, mission, and faith.

We talk a lot about stewardship but it's good to remind ourselves frequently that stewardship includes money, but it isn't just about money. Everything that is, belongs to God, and as human beings, we're, to use a modern expression, in middle management. We can choose how we use the gifts God has given us in positive ways, negative ways, neutral ways. How do we choose to use our time? How do we choose to use our energy? How do we choose to take care of our bodies—do we

feed them well, nourish them with good food, plenty of fresh clean water, proper rest, and a balance between stress and calm? And yes, how do we choose to use our money? God's gospel is for free, but when we gather we do have a responsibility to pay the light bill and the taxes, and overhead, and salaries...you get the picture. Since the stewardship committee will be covering our faith communities financial responsibilities, I'm going to highlight our worship together. Liturgy, means the work of the people. The more people we have involved in our worship together, the better we're able to worship God. Why? Because we're all children of God, and when we take care to represent that vast array of our beautiful, precious, talented people, it makes God happy and it's a good reminder to us. On a practical side it takes a whole team of people from making sure our space is clean and orderly, to making sure everyone can see and hear God's good news. To be better stewards of our resources, we're going to get a little more organized. Sherrill Stacy has stepped forward and offered to be our volunteer coordinator. So, we ask that if you already volunteer in some capacity during worship you fill out a form with your preferred contact information and how frequently you volunteer. If you don't regularly help but would like to, fill out a form. Sherrill will compile all of that information and from it coordinate a schedule for each and be a hub for communication.

Onto mission. We're familiar with mission statements in our modern world. But mission, in the kingdom of God, goes beyond a mere mission statement. Jesus called the disciples, equipped, trained, and empowered, then sent them out into the world, two by two, to do work in his name. Same with us. How has God gathered the community of Emanuel and what has God uniquely equipped and empowered us for? What heart beats at the center of our community? What have we been given a special passion for? Our recent vitality survey indicated that we value including all sorts of people and are willing to make sure they have what they need to feel included and valued. We do this with hearing assisted devices, and bathrooms that accommodate people with differing mobility needs, and in lots of other ways. We're generous, warm-hearted folks who gladly give when we learn of a need.

And we value the power of the gospel—in word and in action. Every Joyful Noise, every Mitten/Hat/Scarf Christmas tree, every time we pack up leftovers and drop them off to folks who could use the food, we put our live out our faith in concrete practical ways. Guess what, that's also stewardship.

Finally, faith. Faith, trust and belief are all interwoven together—don't believe me? Look it up in the Oxford English Dictionary and look at the word origins, fascinating stuff. As Lutherans we believe it is the power of the Holy Spirit that makes faith possible. In the 3rd article of the Apostle's Creed in the small catechism Luther writes: I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true. Faith is the gas in the car, the stuff that makes it possible to believe, that makes it possible to gather, for the Holy Spirit to enlighten, equip and empower us for God to send us out in our mission.

Luther once wrote, we're called to be little Christ's in our world. Our giving of ourselves, our time, our resources, our gifts, and abilities are given freely for the sake of the gospel. We give because we can, because we've been blessed, because we see a need that we're uniquely equipped to help with. That giving, unselfishly, without any expectation, points beyond our rat race of a world, to God's world, and to God. Which is just what Jesus did—hence we're little Christs.

Stewardship, mission, faith—they're all interconnected, and much cooler than they may sound. Serving God is rad! It's the most fulfilling, demanding, challenging, and an experience that fills and completes like no other. It's worth giving our lives to!

Amen, so be it!

Do you feel called to ministry but not necessarily to full-time ordained ministry? The ELCA offers the Synod Authorized Minister (SAM) program.

SAMs are lay leaders trained and authorized by the synod to serve small congregations that may not be able to call a rostered pastor. They provide worship leadership, pastoral care, and sacraments under the synod's appointment.

Preparation includes study in Bible, Lutheran theology, worship, spirituality, leadership, and pastoral skills, through programs such as Select Learning, synod courses, or seminary classes.






