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Periodic Pastoral Ponderings

(From a guy who likes alliteration a lot)

Dear friends in Christ,

On April 28th, the congregation elected five members to fill out the call committee here at Emanuel. I am writing this article prior to that election, so they aren't yet known to us. Those five people join Nick Rickard, church council liaison, and Judy Heithoff, who was appointed by the council to be sure that there was carryover from the process of drafting the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). That profile is the document available to potential candidates for call here at Emanuel. That document will soon be "live" on the ELCA web site and available to any ELCA pastor for reading and reflection.

The MSP was drafted by the FAITH team because that group was in the best position to develop an effective document in a short amount of time. In fact, the FAITH Team (and the Transition Team before it) have been preparing this document in a variety of ways for the past five years. They have done excellent work.

Now the call committee will begin its work with the Western Iowa Synod to identify and vet potential candidates for interview and ultimately for call as pastor here. Please keep several things in mind. First, you can suggest potential candidates to any member of the call committee. Making a suggestion doesn't guarantee that the candidate will be considered, but the more potential candidates the better. Even if a candidate you suggest doesn't become the next pastor at Emanuel, that person may end up being a fine pastor elsewhere in the synod.

Second, the names of those being considered by the Call Committee must remain confidential until a candidate has been recommended for call. It is likely that the candidate is serving another congregation. If the candidate doesn't come to Emanuel, then we could create difficulties for that pastor by not keeping this process confidential. So please don't ask call committee members who they are considering. They won't tell you until the appropriate time. And please don't ask what is discussed with candidates during the process. That information is also a confidential part of the process.

Third, the Holy Spirit is guiding the process. Several of you have asked who the next pastor here will be. My answer has been, "God knows." That's not a cry of desperation. That is a declaration of faith. The Spirit already knows and is preparing the next pastor for Emanuel Lutheran Church. We trust that the Spirit will lead us to that person at the appropriate time.

Fourth, the Call Committee will make regular reports on their progress at Sunday worship services. So stay tuned.


