A Post from the Pastor

...Some assembly required. This was the theme for the synod assembly this year that recently took place at the Sioux Center convention center. The first call pastors, including me, were asked to carry in items to construct our worship space: saw horses and an old door for the altar, a quilt top for the parament, candlesticks, a plate and cup, and I got to carry a green plastic Menards bucket with plants in it. I always wanted to be a flower girl

And it was on my birth-

day.

This theme of some assembly required seemed especially fitting as the church in Western Iowa Synod looks to the future at what the church looks like after a worldwide pandemic. Creativity, thinking outside the box, finding ways to be faithful to our heritage in this world of constant change. When I think of our community here at Emanuel I ask the same questions. What will our future look like as we move forward into our yet as unknown future? What will change, and how will we prepare for it? For us, too, some assembly is required.

Once of my favorite parts of synod assembly were the service projects. We could sign up for one of 15 groups and set out for lunch and a couple of hours of work. I went to a domestic abuse shelter and rolled up donations of Lula Roe pants and chatted with my young coworker—a 20 year old bank teller from Sioux City. She shared with me that she came back to church because she missed singing in the choir and getting to spend time with her church family. She thought that if someone called her letting her know that she was missed it would probably have encouraged her to come back to church sooner.

Last fall our finance committee led us in discussion groups for stewardship month and complied all of our input and presented it to the council. I also want to invite all of you to take part as well. If you see someone missing at church you can Reach Out to them and let them know you miss them and invite them back to church. And this, is, guess what? Outreach! Someone pointed out to me that inviting folks back to church is also a form of outreach.

I think the more we can share the good news outside of our four walls the better. We are a loving, kind and welcoming group of people and we need to get the word out that we're here and can be a church home for all kinds of people where God's love abounds.

I've been in contact recently with St. Paul's Episcopal about meeting in order to plan doing some ministry together. We have interest in working together to see where we can come together to better serve our neighbors with Christ's love. This is exciting for me...stay tuned!

At synod assembly Isaiah 43:19 was another theme, "For behold I am doing a new thing, can you not see it?" God is already at work in our world and in our city, and in our community and in ourselves continually making something new. We are invited to stop and take the time to look and see what God is up to in the world and join in that work.

Ready to be surprised by God?


